

Groups hear of Bengalis' need

STOUFFVILLE — The horrors of Bangla Desh compared with Canada's affluence were presented to three local groups on Sunday.

At Parkview Home, Memorial Christian Church, and at the Youth Centre, Dr. William Newell of World Vision of Canada showed the film "Cry Bangla!" and spoke on the Christian's responsibility in a needy world.

"I don't believe I can expect God to give me more of what I want when there are those who are dying because of lack of food," Dr. Newell told the church group. "I can't believe God intended it this way."

Dr. Newell, who accompanied Global Television in their filming of "Cry Bangla!" told of his personal reactions while visiting ravaged Bangladesh every day from starvation or disease.

Dr. Newell mentioned that "some of us are being challenged to change our lifestyle" in view of the need around the world. "We really can get along on two meals a day and live on less than 90 per cent of our incomes."

People in the Global Television film, he said, were not playing. People who were filmed died while they were there, he said.

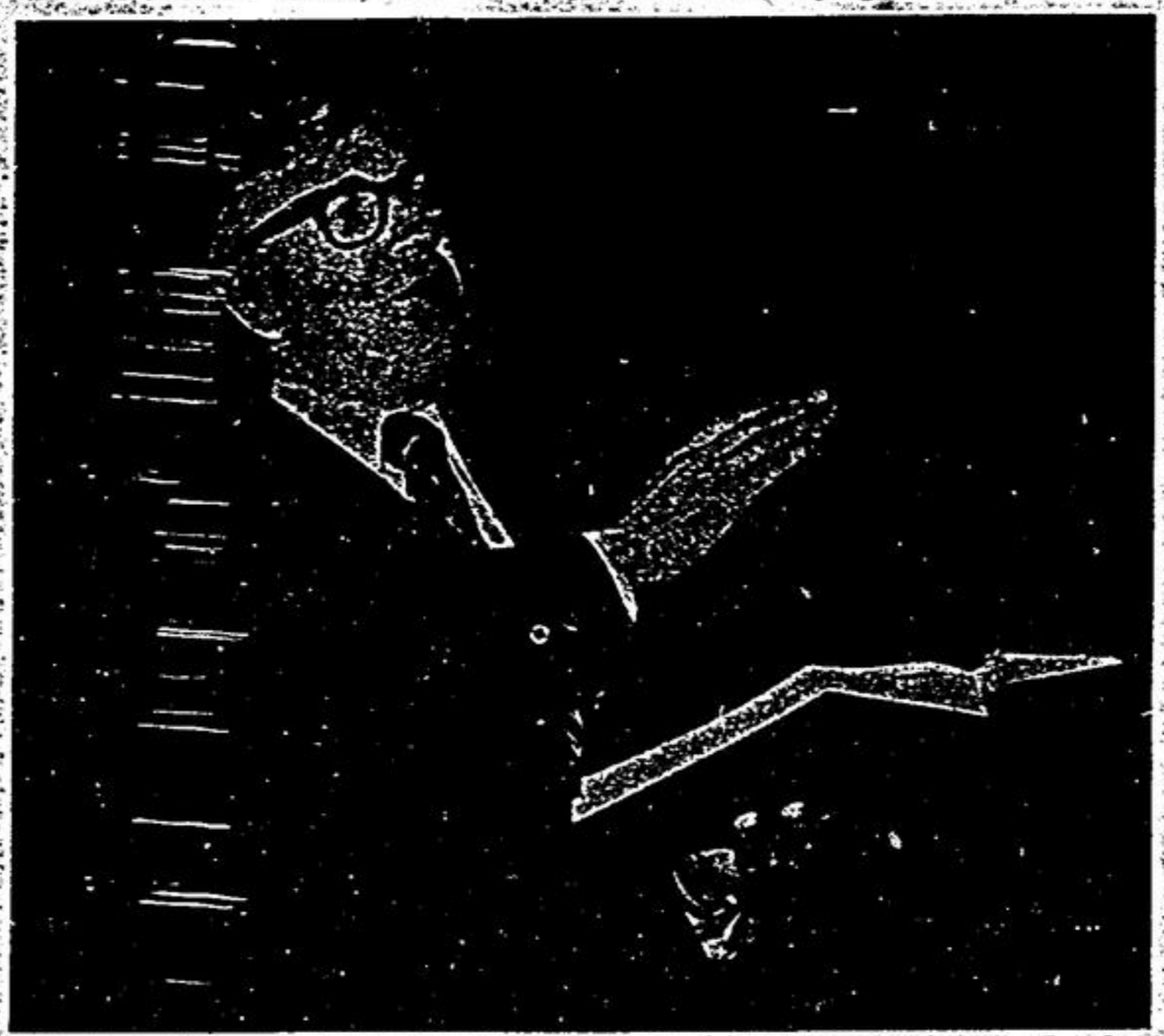
People are dying, and we have some means by which they can be reached," he summarized. "Just because we cannot do everything is no reason we can't do something."

"While we nourish in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ, I believe people will honor what we will do," he said.

He pointed out that while the average Canadian lives on \$3,600 yearly, his Bengali counterpart has \$28 or \$30. They live on fewer than 400 calories per day, he said.

With the last World Vision food shipment, Dr. Newell said, they had been certain that the food went directly to the people who needed it. Other relief operations have been plagued with black-market trading on the part of government officials and others.
