Five year warranty on piece

STOUFFVILLE — Ray Spiers, an associate of Patricia Fulford the sculptress, told The Tribune the piece had developed minor repairs last week.

some cracks on the inside surfaces.

He was unsure whether the cracks were a result of somebody banging into the sculpture or whether it had not been given enough time to set before being installed.

The cracks were ground out and then filled with fibreglass. The process required only a few hours. According to Mr. Spiers the purchase terms of the piece include a five year warranty period. He said in some cases the artist is required to guarantee a sculpture for up to 10 years.

He disagreed with people's complaints about the cost of the sculpture. He quoted the price as \$2,300, rather than the \$2,500 figure given out by Public Works.

A bronze sculpture of about the same size he estimated would have

cost in the neighbourhood of \$25,000.

As well as guaranteeing the sculpture for five years the artist is required to insure the piece at a cost of \$150 during construction and placement and the artist is responsible for installation.

"Every one's an original," he commented, "with different sorts of problems." He estimated the artist made about \$40 a week profit on the piece.

Mr. Spiers, who worked on the construction of it, said it took a year to complete "working on and off." The piece weighs about a thousand pounds and has between 300 and 400 pounds of steel reinforcing in it. "People will beef about that (the sculpture)," he concluded, "but they don't say anything about those damned ugly paper boxes."

10 hospitalized, youth convicted

GUELPH — A 17-year-old youth was fined \$500 and had his driver's license suspended, as a result of an accident involving a Gormley area woman.

Peter Madsen, 17 of Guelph was found guilty in provincial court of dangerous driving after the court heard testimony of how the car he was driving was travelling at speeds up to 95 m.p.h.

The collision occurred near Guelph on Aug. 14. The Madsen car struck a car driven by Lois Wideman, advertising representative of The Tribune.

Mrs. Wideman was returning to Gormley from Tavistock and had four young girls with her in the car. Mrs. Wideman suffered a severe concussion in the crash and her daughter Helen, 10 received a broken arm and severe throat cuts. Another daughter Ruth-Anne, and two nieces Sandra and Susan Beynon were also injured in the crash.

Three girls aged 12, 14 and 15 each told Judge H. R. Howitt that Madsen was driving very fast. Two of the girls said they saw the speedometer of the car from the back seat and said the needle showed the car travelling at 95 m.p.h.

Constable Frank Beradine of the Guelph Police Department said that he found skid marks at the scene that extended 335 feet back from the point of impact.

Mr. Madsen was fined \$500 and was prohibited from driving anywhere in Canada for two years, after being found guilty of dangerous driving.
