40 years in Gormley

GORMLEY — Long-time Gormley resident Laura Bertha Hoover died peacefully at Cobblestones Nursing Home in Aurora Tuesday, Dec. 31.

Born in 1897 in New Jersey, she was the daughter of the late Rev. J.E. Fidler and Elizabeth Rittenhouse. As a child, she accompanied her missionary parents to Turkey where they served during part of their several years in the ministry.

At an early age, Bertha felt the call to spiritual work and served most successfully at Petrolia, St. Catharines, and St. Thomas as a City Mission Worker under what was then known as the Mennonite Brethren in Christ Church (now known as the Missionary Church) of the Ontario conference.

In 1934 she married Allan Hoover of Gormley and lived there for the past 40 years. As her health began to fail in 1970, Mrs. Hoover retired to Cobblestones Nursing Home.

Surviving besides her husband are three sons: David of Gormley, Keith of Montreal and Paul of Denver, Colorado, and seven grandchildren, also two sisters — Ruth (Mrs.


