### Laura Bertha Hoover

## 40 years in Gormley

GORMLEY — Long-time Gormley resident, Laura Bertha Hoover died peacefully at Cobblestone Nursing Home in Aurora Tuesday, Dec. 31.

Born in 1897 in New Jersey, she was the daughter of the late Rev. J.E. Fidler and Elizabeth Rittenhouse. As a child, she accompanied her missionary parents to Turkey where they served during part of their several years in the ministry.

At an early age, Bertha felt the call to spiritual work and served most successfully at Petrolia, St. Catharines and St. Thomas as a City Mission Worker, under what was then known as the Mennonite Brethren in Christ Church (now known as the Missionary Church) of the Ontario conference.

She was a very capable speaker and talented singer and will be remembered by some as she sang most capably in the City Mission Workers' Quartette. In 1925, she felt a call to Syria and served there until 1930. She later served as the first director of the Ontario Conference Women's Missionary Society.

In 1934 she married Allan Hoover of Gormley and lived there for the past 40 years. As her health began to fail in 1970, Mrs. Hoover retired to Cobblestone Nursing Home.

Surviving besides her husband are three sons: David of Gormley, Keith of Montreal and Paul of Denver, Colorado, and seven grandchildren, also two sisters — Ruth (Mrs.

Alvin Losie) of South Bend, Indiana, and Ethel (Mrs. Gordon Johnston) of Blenheim. She was predeceased by three sisters and two brothers — Naomi, Anna (Mrs. Harry Haack), John Elsie and Elmer.

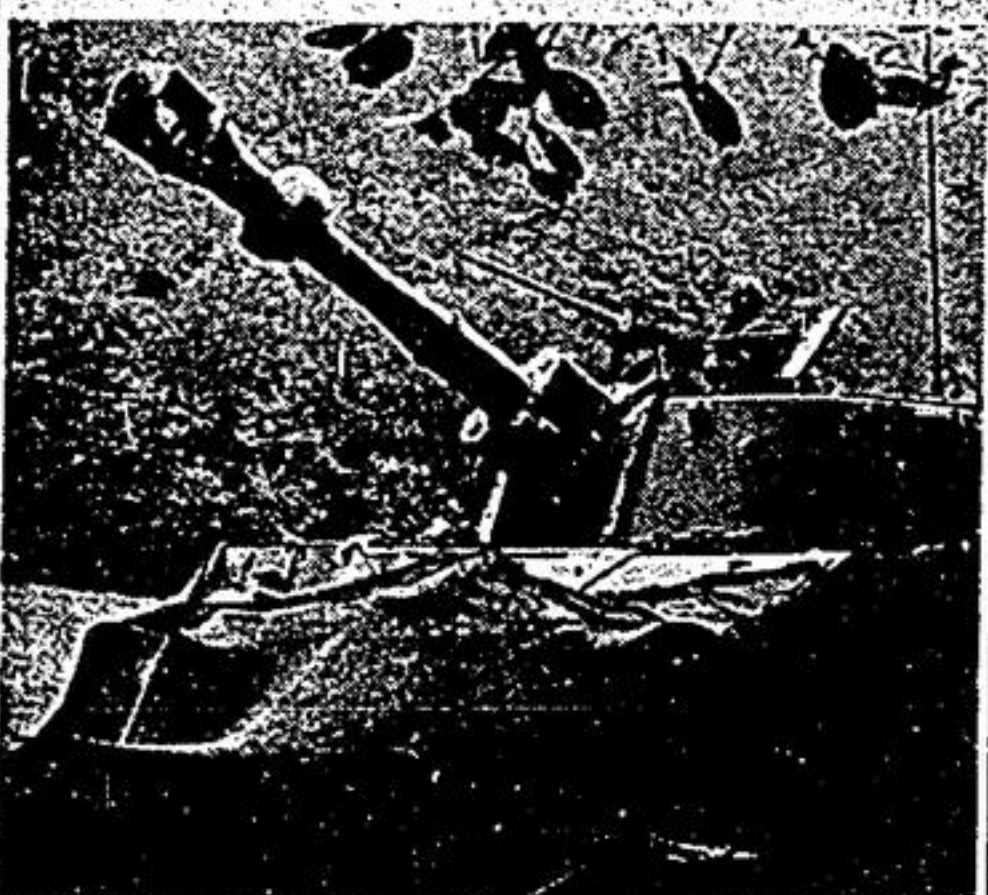

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### OPP seek truck and blonde youth

MAIDSTONE — Ontario Provincial Police are looking for a cream-colored pick-up truck in connection with the shotgun killing of a Windsor man Dec. 17.

In a press release, Chief Inspector Fred R. Blucher, said that illicit drugs have been linked to the death of Douglas Harold Renaud. Police are seeking a cream-colored pick-up truck driven by a youth

with long blonde hair, that was reported seen in the area of Maidstone Township about the time of death. The killing occurred 3:40 p.m., Dec. 17. No definite connection has been established between the vehicle and the shooting, Inspector Blucher said.

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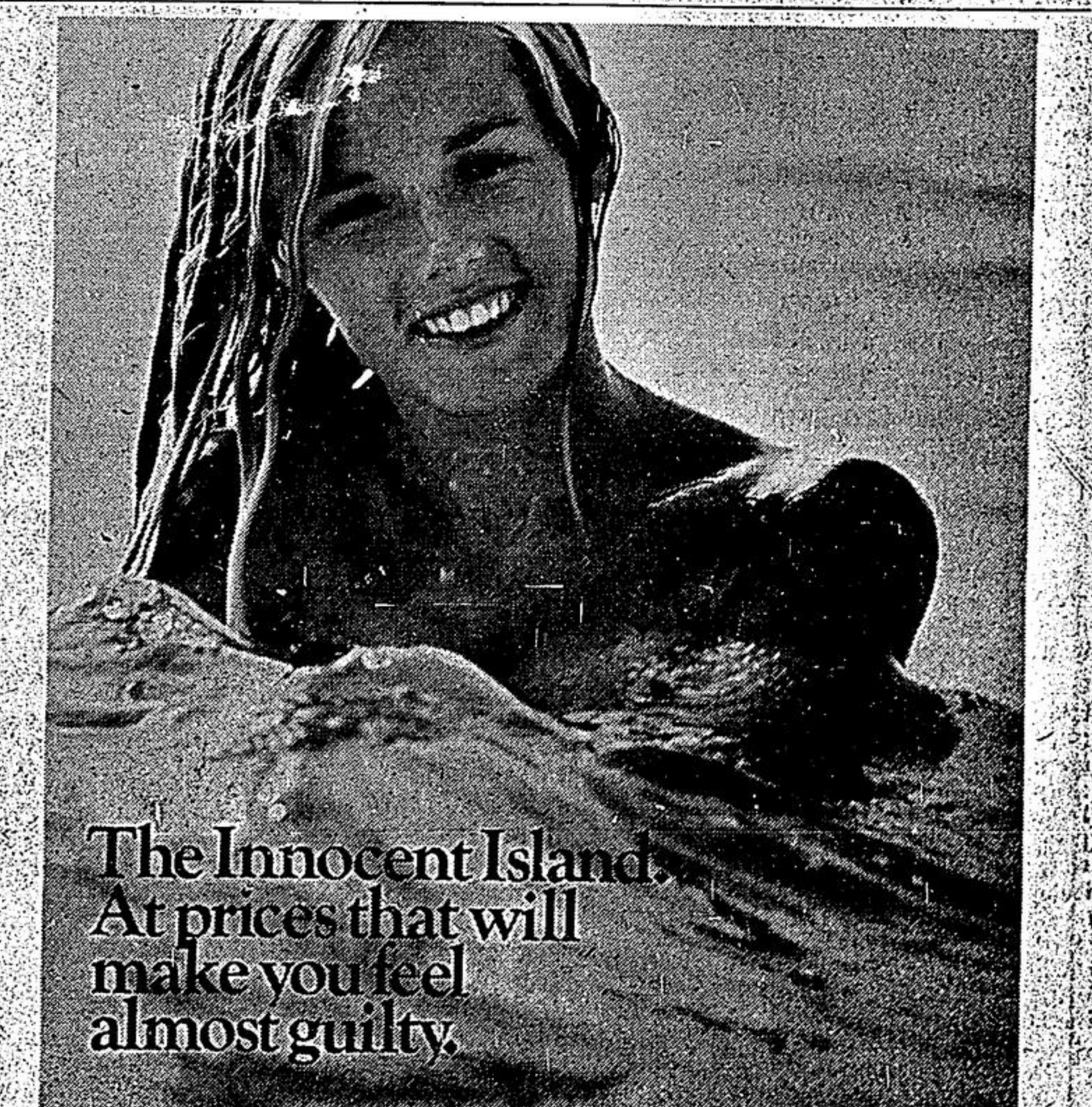
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### Notice: Employers and Employees New Employment Standards Act

Effective January 1, 1975 the new Employment Standards Act covers the existing standards: minimum wage, vacation pay, overtime pay, termination pay, collection of wages and provides for:

**Public Holidays**  
Employees are entitled to seven paid statutory holidays: New Year's Day, Good Friday, Victoria Day, Dominion Day, Labour Day, Thanksgiving and Christmas Day. (Conditions and exceptions apply in certain situations.)

**Overtime Pay**  
Overtime pay at one and one-half the regular rate for hours in excess of forty-four in a week.

**Equal Benefits**  
The Equal Benefits provision will be brought into force at a later date.

**Pregnancy Leave**  
Pregnancy leave is extended to seventeen weeks for employees with one year's service or more and covers all employers having one or more employees.

**Transportation**  
The Act no longer requires an employer to provide transportation for female employees finishing or starting work between the hours of midnight and six o'clock in the forenoon or prohibits females under 18 working after midnight.

These are the principal amendments and changes to the Act.
