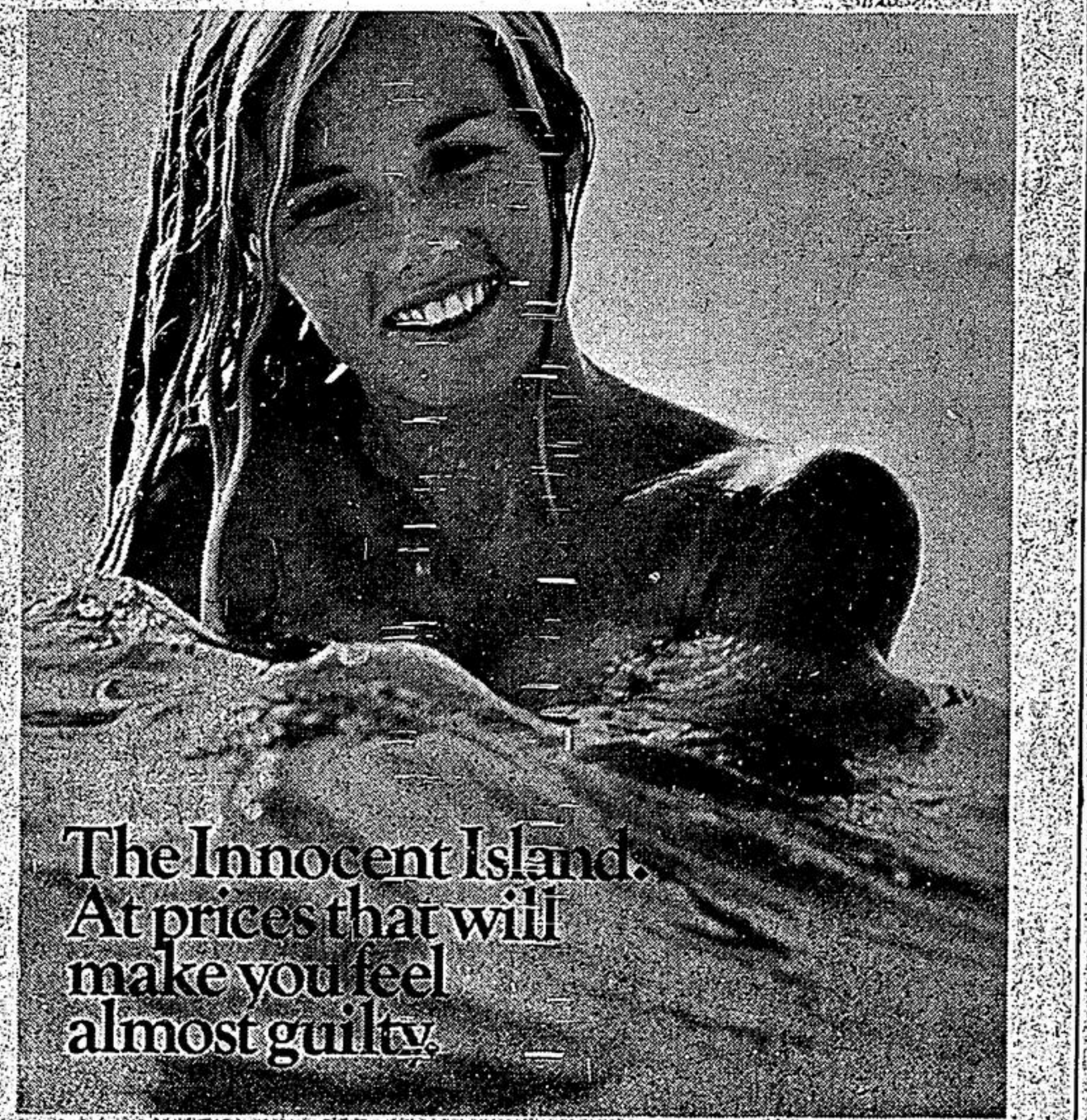

Fragments

We are loved, accepted

Gather up the fragments that remain that nothing be lost. — John 6:12
St. Paul's letter to Romans is directed to all Christians whether Jews or Gentiles. There were a number of Christian circles and meeting places but no church in Rome as there was in Corinth, Galatia or Thessalonica. The Christians were almost wholly Gentiles who understood the Old Testament religion but were anxious to understand Christianity rightly. St. Paul was instrumental, by letter and by word, while he was a prisoner there, in fusing into one church the converted Romans.

Christian love in one another, he told them, must be genuine, sincere, unfeigned, without hypocrisy, not in word only but in deed and truth, and it must also be as in a family, affectionate and tender. To love people like this, he said, does not mean to agree with their trends, their ideas and their faults. Similarly, hatred of men's vices must not hinder anyone from delighting and cleaving to that which is good in any person. The Good News for all time is that although we are often wrong, we are still loved and accepted. That is why we love Jesus. He is the one Person who knows everything about us, and still loves and accepts us. We must do no less for each other. The most difficult thing for us to do is to admit that we were wrong, but self-justification cripples us. Love and humility go together. We must unmask ourselves and reach and accept another person. Finally, St. Paul says: "Hope, patience and prayer are powerful supports under all conditions and in all trials, and true hospitality, accompanied by common sense, is an important part of Christian Charity. Jesus, in sympathy with innocent human joy and true hospitality, turned water into the best wine at the wedding feast where He was a guest, along with His mother and five or six of His disciples. He revealed by this sign God's goodness and overwhelming bounty, and His Own Divine nature and glory of His Messiahship. Jesus cares. Jesus loves. All Christians are one in Him. Praise be to Christ. Thanks be to God. "Let love be without dissimulation. Abhor that which is evil; cleave to that which is good. Be kindly affectioned one to another with brotherly love, in honor preferring one another; not slothful in business; fervent in spirit; serving the Lord; rejoice in hope; patient in tribulation; continuing instant in prayer; distributing to the necessity of saints; given to hospitality (Rom. 12:9-13)
