The history of the Mennonite movement goes back to 1525 when

Martin Luther made his historic break with the Roman Catholic Church. Conrad Grebel and Felix Manz rebelled against having to agree that the authority of the state would apply in church matters.

Jan. 21, 1525 they met in the Felix Manz home and baptized each other thus signalling a break with the other reform traditions.

The Towne Cinema in Markham will feature a movie entitled, "Happy as the Grass was Green" as part of this anniversary celebration. It is a film about a Mennonite family in Pennsylvania.

It will be showing at that theatre from Feb. 21 to 27.
