STOUFFVILLE — Well wishers crowded into the home of Mr. and Mrs. Norm Fretz, Sunday, to honor his mother May Fretz on her 80th birthday.
Over 200 people attended the open house.
Mrs. Fretz was born on Valentine's Day, Feb. 14, 1895 in Almira-May Grove. She was the daughter of Levi and Susan Grove. The family moved to Altona and May

Grove attended Altona Public School.
She married Samuel Fretz on March 17, 1920 and the couple farmed near Altona until they retired to Stouffville in 1950. They lived on Main St. E.
The Fretz's started the first Christian Bookstore in Stouffville in their living room. Mr. Fretz died in 1959 and Mrs. Fretz carried on until four years ago when the business was sold to Marie Adams.

Mrs. Fretz recently sold her house and will move into Parkview apartments.
She has been a member of the Wideman Mennonite Church for the past 50 years and has been active in the sewing circle and especially loves gardening and quilting.
Although she will not have a garden at her new home, she plans to keep active.

"I expect to help my children, they have gardens," she told The Tribune.
She has six children — Alma (Mrs. Lewis Reesor) of Markham; Norm of Stouffville; Orval of Claremont; Lois (Mrs. Maurice Hoover) of R.R. 1, Stouffville; Levi of Manilla; Mary Ann (Mrs. Beland Schlabach) of Vineland. There are also 21 grandchildren and two great grandchildren.
