## Benefits parents, students

GOODWOOD — Besides teachers and students, Goodwood Public School has had a third category for some time: lay assistants. Parents of various children in the school have been helping out in the school program.

In the primary grades, lay assistants listen to children read orally, and help with word, number and

phonics drills among other things. "If a teacher can handle their program without parents, that's fine," said Mr. Smith. "I

wouldn't force it on any teacher." If any teacher feels that a lay assistant could be of help in the classroom, he contacts Mr. Smith, who has a list of volunteer parents with their special abilities.

## Annual hockey tournament held

GOODWOOD — On February 27 the annual Goodwood-Webb Hockey Tournament was played. The schools who entered a team were Lincoln Ave., Valleyview, Claremont, Uxbridge, Epsom, Thorah Central, Scott Central, Goodwood, Webb, and Zephyr. Epsom advanced to the finals against Scott Central and won 5-3. The games were played in the Sunderland and Uxbridge arenas.

According to principal Jim Smith, the program has allowed children to have more individual attention and to "have an opportunity to talk with an adult."

Parents who have helped out, in turn, have gained an appreciation for what goes on at the school. "It cuts down on the gap between home and school," Mr. Smith said.

Mr. Smith feels that screening the parents may eliminate many of the problems before they begin. For instance, he explained, they "try to avoid having a parent work with their own child."

The lay assistants are of three types: those who regularly come to help in the primary rooms, the library and in special education; those who are on-call for helping on excursions and sports days; and the most recent addition, the "talent bureau." Those parents help out in "Student Elective Interest Groups" on Friday afternoon, giving assistance in a variety of activities including sewing, cooking, dancing, photography, chess and small engine repair.

This week at the Sunderland Town Hall on Tuesday March 4 and Thursday March 6, Mrs. St. John will be accompanying teachers to the Music Festival. Children have been practising for choirs, duets and solos.

On Wednesday March 5, schools in the Durham Region will be closed to provide time for a Teacher Development Workshop at R.H. Conish.

Also, open communication between teachers and lay assistants helps to eliminate difficulties, he added. All of the experiences with the lay assistance program "have been very worthwhile and very positive," Mr. Smith concluded.

## Latcham t.v. program elicits mixed replies

STOUFFVILLE — Local Samaritan, Art Latcham, has received several phone calls and about a dozen letters since he was featured in a CBC Christmas special program.

Mr. Latcham said some of the people who contacted him had known him years ago but many he had never heard of before. The television program outlined Mr. Latcham's generosity to the communities in the Stouffville area and as a result he received several requests for money.

He received a letter from a W.A. Bennett of Castlegar British Columbia requesting Mr. Latcham's "formula for such good health at 79." Mr. Latcham is of the opinion the letter-writer is the former Premier of British Columbia.
