MPP Donald Deacon

Resignation announced

UNIONVILLE — Citing family and business reasons, Donald Deacon, MPP for York Centre announced last week that he will not run in the upcoming election.

In a letter mailed out to Liberal supporters in the riding, Mr. Deacon said pressures on his stockbrokerage firm, founded by his father led him to decide to devote full time to the company after the election.

Mr. Deacon challenged Robert Nixon for the party leadership in 1973 and was appointed deputy leader last year.

The following is the text of his letter:

For the past eight years, I have enjoyed serving you and York Centre as your full time M.P.P., hopefully in what you see as your best interest.

My work as your M.P.P. has involved a total full time commitment. Unfortunately it has caused my own personal and business affairs to suffer. As a result I have had to become involved again in my former business.

I find it impossible to do justice to two such important responsibilities at the same time even though my work week is seldom less than 80 hours. It is, therefore, with sincere regret that I have decided not to seek re-election as your Member of the Ontario Legislature in the election expected later this year.

I shall continue to represent you at Queen's Park until the next election. It has not been easy to reach this decision because I have never enjoyed any work as much as that of being your M.P.P.

Thank you for the assistance, encouragement and support you have given me. I am sure my successor will appreciate receiving the same when she or he takes over.

Council wins battle for 3-way stop sign

STOUFFVILLE — Town council have apparently won their long-running battle with the Regional Engineering Department to have a three way stop sign installed at the intersection of Edward St. and Harold Ave.

The purpose of the stop is to control speeding in the vehicles on Edward St. coming to and from the Stouffville District Secondary School.

The engineering and report recommended the stop signs not be approved on the grounds they should not be used as a speed control device but regional council voted to disregard the report and they approved the stop sign.

Council last week passed an amendment to the by-law, necessitated by a mistake in the original by-law. The amended by-law must now be approved by the region and the Ministry of Transportation and Communications.
