

2 men arrested

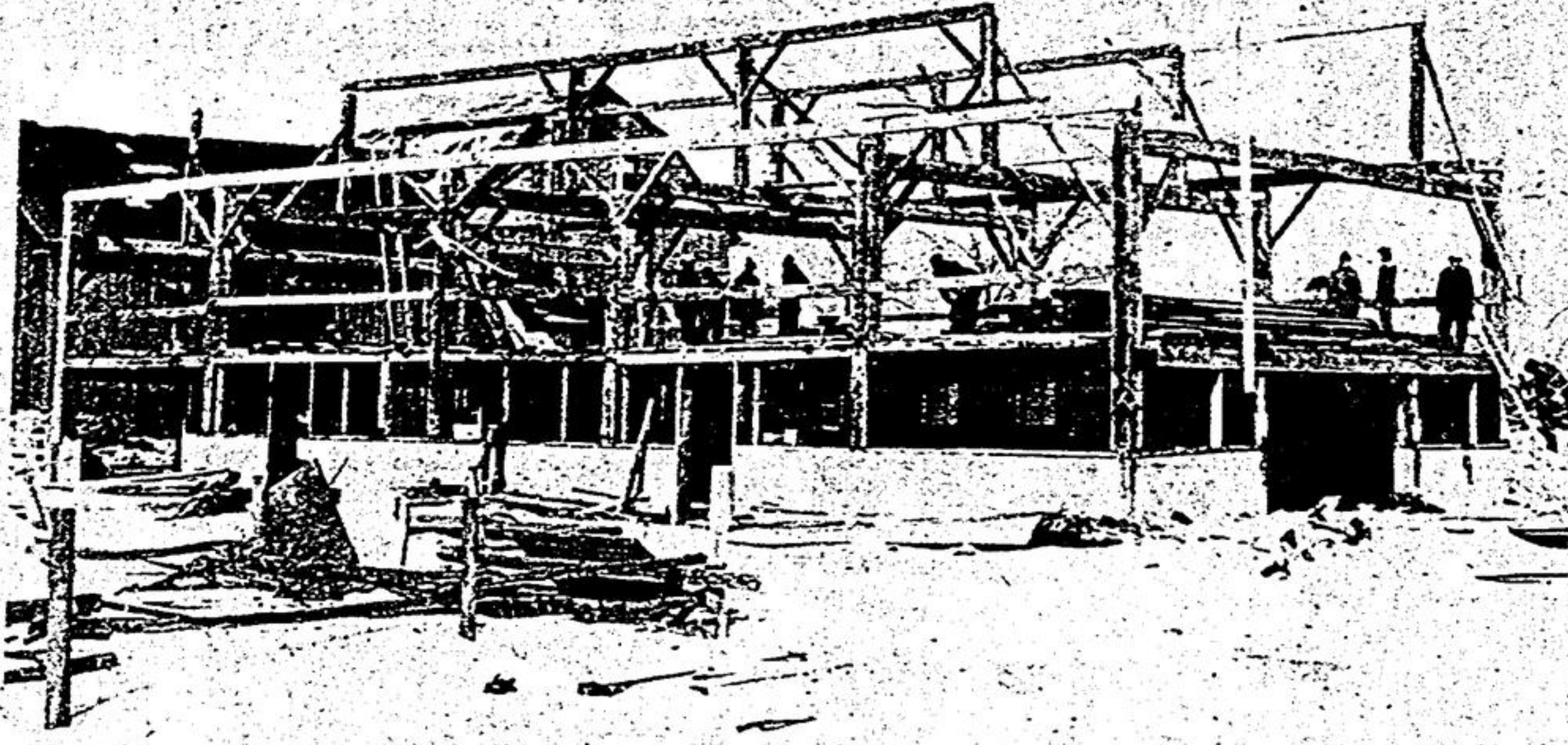
STOUFFVILLE — Two Stouffville area men have been charged with theft in connection with a break-in at the Satellite Automotive Store in Markham.

CEDAR VALLEY — On learning his proposal for a private country club on Faulkner Ave. was refused, Fritz Wagener has requested council reconsider allowing five acre parcels.

In a letter to council Mr. Wagener pointed out the application was refused on the grounds it would not be desirable in a residential area.

Mr. Wagener reasoned that, "Since officially Faulkner Ave. is not residential but rural, members of the board appeared to be of the opinion that a change is inevitable. This brings us back to the application brought before the board last November, requesting five acre parcels on Faulkner Ave."

Councillor Merlyn Baker expressed sympathy with the request but said council had a commitment to the other area residents as they had been informed no action would be taken until they came to an agreement among themselves.

"They can't make up their minds, maybe we have to do it for them," commented Councillor Cathy Joyce.

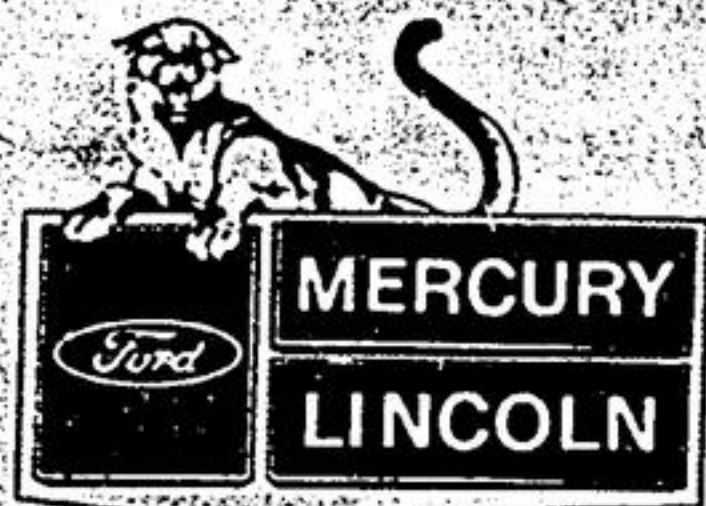
