Watermain to be extended

STOUFFVILLE — An extension to the Main St. watermain will permit an expansion of Country Ready Mix Ltd.

A resolution passed by council last week calls for an extension of the line from Palmwood Gate westerly approximately 885 feet.

The town will contribute \$20,000 to the cost which will then be charged back to future industrial developments which are expected to occur adjacent to the extension.

The remainder of the bill will be picked up by Gino Testa, owner of Country Ready Mix. The price has been quoted as \$20,900 excluding road and sod restoration, watermain grades or layout, engineering fees and inspection.

In addition to these fees Mr. Testa will be required to lay 1,400 feet of pipe to connect the main to his business.

Mr. Testa currently has a two inch water line which he has found inadequate for peak production periods. The line he is planning to install will be a six inch one which will allow him further expansion.

Currently 120 people

are employed at Country Ready Mix and Mr. Testa is expecting 10 more trucks to be delivered at the end of the month at which time he will be hiring approximately 15 more people.

According to Mr. Testa, the equipment for the expansion has already been installed. He told The Tribune he will begin to lay his portion of the watermain immediately and he expects it to be completed next month.

Councillor June Button raised strenuous objection to the money for the work being taken from the municipal water account.

She insisted the money should be removed from the general tax account and not from the water account as the money is there for emergency repairs to the watermain. She estimated the line coming from the Stouffville wells was installed around 1890 and could not be depended on to last.
