New number soon for canine control

WHITCHURCH-STOUFFVILLE — The Town's new animal control service gets underway next month with residents of Whitchurch-Stouffville able to call a local number for service.

The Kennel Inn in Aurora is taking on canine control for Aurora and King as well. It operates out of premises on Highway 11, just south of Aurora.

According to a press release from Kennel Inn, animal control is becoming more important than ever because of the population explosion of pets.

The Kennel Inn offers indoor-outdoor pound facilities which will be open through the week and also on Saturday mornings. Three radio equipped trucks operated by trained wardens will be on patrol and will respond to emergency calls regarding injured animals, or pets in distress.

'Doubtful' letter baffles commission

NEWMARKET — So far this year, York Regional Police have received 54 complimentary letters and one complaint. They've also received one letter Chief Bruce Crawford classifies as "doubtful".

The letter, tabled at Monday night's police commission meeting, was from Howard J. Reynolds, a consultant for York County Board of Education.

He got a speeding ticket in King City on Jan. 30, and commissioners were a bit bewildered Monday when they heard his letter.

Mr. Reynolds said the policeman who stopped him was "courteous and respectful" and assured the commission that his letter was one of "support and not of complaint".

He was stopped for allegedly travelling between 40 and 45 miles per hour in a 30-mile zone. Mr. Reynolds claimed he was doing 30 when stopped by the officer and said he had just decelerated from a 50-mile speed zone over a 1,000 ft. stretch.

Despite the officer's courtesy, Mr. Reynolds suggested that York's young policemen may need "training in assessment of people" and "training in human relationship and intent".

While gratified at Mr. Reynolds' praise, the commission didn't know what to make of his constructive criticism. "I'm not sure I know what he's getting at, frankly," said Chief Bruce Crawford.
