Hill school feeds SDSS

DICKSON'S HILL - All the students from Dickson's Hill will take their high school training in Stouffville in the future following re-drawing of the school boundaries it was announced at the York County Board of Education meeting recently. Dickson's Hill Public School will become a formal "feeder school" for Stouffville Dist. Secondary School.

The southern boundary for SDSS will be set at Lots 21 and 22 and thus feeding all the students from the hamlet to Stouffville. Present SDSS boundary is at Lots 21 and 24. The change will become effective Sept. 1. Students in the transferred area, who presently attend Markham Dist. High School, will be allowed to complete their secondary school education at MDHS.
