Many residents of this area will be shocked and shaken to hear of the plane crash so close to home. A husband and wife were killed in the accident. In most such tragedies there are some who narrowly escape death. In this case earlier passengers, motorists on the highway and others safely inside their homes. These people escaping death or injury by hours, minutes or a few feet. The amazing phenomena as far as death is concerned is that it takes the majority by surprise. The Bible says "In the midst of life we are in death". Nevertheless by the way many people live one would think life was certain and death was unlikely. "If I know human nature at all I expect there will be comments like "Why did God permit that? I know of no life insurance company that will insure a person on their death bed. What court would consider the complaint against the highway department on behalf of a motorist who sped past 5 warning signs, crashed two barricades and ended up in the river. In similar manner how can the rebellious human plunging on toward spiritual disaster expect to escape when he neglects and spurs God's great salvation? There is NO ESCAPE.
