

Board chairman Eldred King told the residents that the swimming club plan has apparently failed to mature, as the owner of the land is no longer willing to sell it for the club. This was confirmed by the owner, who was present.




"Pleased to meet you!" Two of the mastiffs pause for a nose-to-nose encounter
