### 90th birthday for lifetime resident

**BLOOMINGTON** — Surrounded by 23 members of her family Mrs. Francis Rose celebrated her 90th birthday April 5 at the home of her daughter.

Mrs. Rose has the claim of being born and raised in Bloomington. Except for a short time in Sharon and the past two years at Parkview Home, Mrs. Rose has lived her whole life in and around the hamlet.

She was born April 5, 1885, Francis Story, on the second farm north of the Bloomington Rd. and the 9th Line. She attended the one-room school in Bloomington.

After finishing school, Mrs. Rose tells of how she used to walk to Stouffville every day to work as a seamstress. She was the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Jarvis Story.

On Dec. 12, 1906 she married Milford Rose, Another Bloomington native, and they lived in Sharon for two years, before moving back to the farm on Lake Rd. Her daughter still lives on the farm.

Her husband farmed throughout those years and the couple had three children — Carl, who still lives on one corner of the farm, Stanley of London and Myrtle (Mrs. Moos) who lives in a house on the farm.

Mrs. Rose was an active member of Ballantrae United Church

for many years and as president of the Women's Association (now known as the United Church Women).

Her husband died 14 years ago and she lived 12 years by herself, before moving into Parkview two years ago. She says that living alone was not too difficult. Either her son or her daughter would

call in daily to see how she was getting along.

She is in good health and talked easily about her past and said that, "I'm well but I don't walk as good." She still manages to walk around with the help of a cane.

She has six grandchildren and four great grandchildren.
