On Windsor bail abuses

Chief's comments asked

NEWMARKET — York Regional Police Chief Bruce Crawford has been asked to submit a report to the Regional Police Commission on the number of persons

abusing the bail Reform Act in the area, prior to consideration of support for a City of Windsor resolution.

The Windsor resolution seeks to amend the present Bail Reform Act in order that better control of known criminals can be effected, by law enforcement agencies and local courts.

Windsor Council has circulated the resolution to 12 Police Commissions in Ontario as well as to the Federal Minister of Justice, the Attorney General and Solicitor General of the Province. The Association of Municipal Police Governing Authorities

has also been requested to support the resolution.

The Windsor request stated that during 1974, 90 individuals charged with serious offences in that area, were released under terms of the Bail Reform Act, committed a total of 323 subsequent offences before trial on the original offence.

The resolution claims that the abuse of the Act is a menace to the public well-being, and that offenders are not discouraged from further crime when release is so readily obtainable.

The resolution also

points to the added costs of maintaining law and order resulting from the intolerable levels of bail abuse.

Windsor is asking that immediate steps be taken to amend the Act for better control.

Chief Crawford told the Regional Police Commission last week that he does not presently have figures pertaining to the Region, to indicate whether or not the bail abuse is growing in the Municipality.

PC meeting in Uxbridge

UXBRIDGE — The Progressive Conservative Association of Durham North (proposed Durham-York) will hold a nominating convention at Uxbridge Secondary School May 21 at 8 p.m.

The purpose will be to select a candidate for the provincial election expected later this year. Environment Minister William Newman has stated he will seek the nomination in Durham North.

He presently represents Ontario South but under redistribution his farm, located at Balsam, is in the new riding of Durham North. Matthew Dymond who has represented the northern riding for many years, announced that he is retiring.

Durham North includes Georgina, East Gwillimbury, Uxbridge, Brock and Scugog townships, and the northern part of the Town of Pickering.

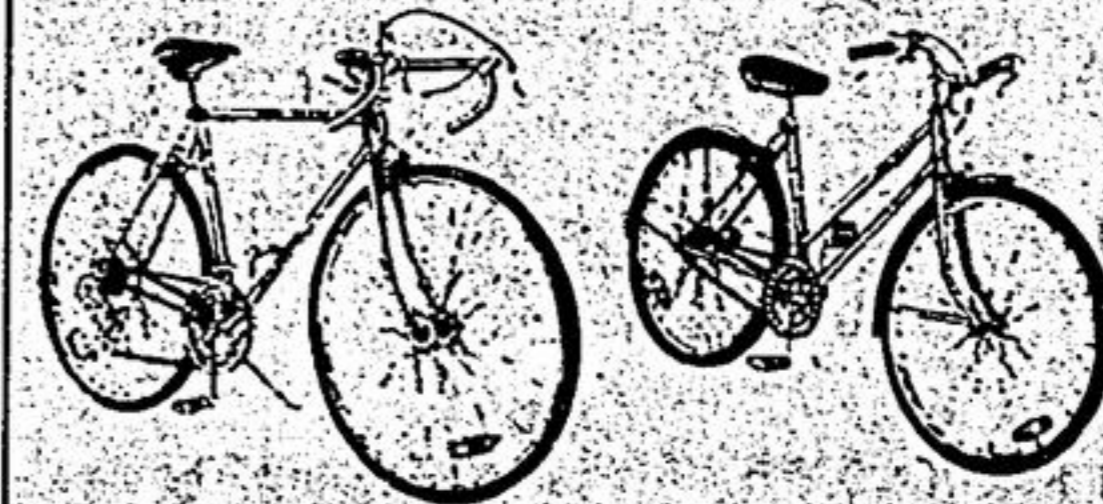
