# Three youths charged after motor stolen

STOUFFVILLE — Three Musselman's Lake youths have been charged with theft over \$200 in connection with the removal of a car motor from behind a building on Main St. in Stouffville. Ian Cuthbertson reported to police a Ford motor valued at \$250 was taken last Friday. Charged are: Steven Guenther, 17, of Valley Rd.; Brett Cashman, 16, and Patrick Casman, 17, both of Hillsdale Dr. The youths were held in custody pending a court hearing this week. According to police the engine has not been recovered.

**Car destroyed**  
A car valued at \$1,000 was completely destroyed on the weekend after a short circuit caused the vehicle to catch fire. The car, belonging to Brian Hood of Markham, was parked on the 6th conc. of Whitchurch Stouffville when it burst into flames. Whitchurch Stouffville Fire Department attended.

**Public mischief**  
Kenneth Harman of Main St. W. in Stouffville has been charged by York Regional Police with two counts of public mischief. Mr. Harman was arrested about an hour after the doors of Shea

Real Estate and Kimburn and Capsley Law Office had been kicked in. According to police reports Mr. Harman was stopped on another matter and as a result of investigation he was charged with public mischief. Police allege Mr. Harman had been drinking at the time of the incident.

**Dealership entered**  
John Roe Ford was broken into last week when someone broke a hole in the glass of a rear window, unlocked the window and entered. The coke, coffee, bubble gum and peanut machines were pried open and several keys were stolen from the office. Damage was estimated at \$50.

**Theft charge**  
Edward Fretz of RR 2 Markham has been charged with theft over \$200. According to police Mr. Fretz entered into a lease agreement with Ian Todd Leasing of Markham for a rubber stamp press in December. Police claim Mr. Fretz made only one payment on the machine valued at \$500 and this was at the time of leasing and that he then sold the press for \$225.

## Hand made is still best

MARKHAM — For Russ Leonard, there's no better way to "get the cobwebs out of your head," than to get out and "feel the power of a horse beneath you." That's the opinion he's developed in the two years he has operated the Shadow Creek Tack Shop on the 7th conc. of Markham.

At the same location is Ian's Custom Saddlery, where Ian Coxworth produces hand-made

bridles, belts and other leather articles. The shop, which sells mostly English-style gear, is primarily interested in "quality goods," according to Mr. Leonard. Although saddles and other items may cost more there, they will last much longer, he says. The sign of quality in leather goods, he said, is the uneven stitching of hand-sewing.

Many of the items

made by Mr. Coxworth, who has been in the leather goods trade for 10 years, are sold in the shop. In addition, training in horsemanship is given to 80 or 90 students year-round. Wooded trails are available in warm weather, while an arena can be used in winter or rain. In the summer, schooling shows are held on the fourth Sunday of the month.

The farm also

boards, feeds and cares for horses. When asked if horsemanship was an expensive hobby, Mr. Leonard said that some people spend more on golfing than they would owning a horse. He estimated a horse could be owned and maintained for about \$1500 a year. In his view, horses are "a constant challenge no matter how good you get."
