Women vow to stop construction

BROUGHAM — Over 100 women have signed a petition vowing to sit down and block bulldozers scheduled to start work next month on the Pickering airport.

The petition was part of the Bulldozer Seminar and Tea held by the People or Planes group in Brougham, April 30.

The petition states that they plan to show their opposition by "sitting on the road in front of the bulldozer or other land violating machinery on the site."

The petition was part of a program that saw the ladies, many wives of prominent politicians and businessmen, attend a briefing and slide presentation at Brougham.

Three busloads then went out to the Ernie Carruthers farm on the 8th Conc. They toured the century-old farmhouse and talked to Mr. Carruthers about having to leave his far.

He explained that he was not planting a crop this year because he had to be off his farm by May 31. He said it would cost him \$500 to plant the crop.

Those taking part included Shirley Crombie, wife of the Mayor of Toronto; and Mollie Newman, wife of Environment Minister Broadcaster June Callwood was also on hand and signed the petition.

In addition telegrams of supports were received from Janet Burton (wife of Pierre Burton), actress Barbara Hamilton, Beryl Plumtre, chairman of the Prices review board and Mrs. Robert Nixon, wife of the Ontario Liberal leader.

According to spokesmen for POP 200 families plan to stay in their homes after the May 31 cutoff date.

The ladies were shown a slide presentation comparing Pickering to Ste. Scholastique where a second Montreal airport is now being built. Historic Pickering homes were compared to deserted buildings with cracked windows on the Quebec site.

Organizers of Wednesday's seminar arranged for a small bulldozer to be parked near the Community Hall as a gesture. The machine was not removed from its trailer.

If budget increase 15%

Taxes will climb \$47

MARKHAM — If the York County Board of Education can hold cost increases to 15 percent, the average taxpayer in Markham, with a residential assessment of \$30,000, will expend \$42.50.

This represents a hike of \$47.50 over 1974. The spending maximum, trustee Don Cousens told a committee meeting of Town Council.

Thursday, is sixty million dollars. This figure, he said, had been reduced to \$56,000,000 with expectations of an additional \$700,000 cut. Mr. Cousens said the Board was attempting to improve its programs and attract good quality teachers. "We will win back the good-will of the staff; the strike cost us heavily."

Trustee Gary Adamson suggested that members were only fooling themselves if they thought the budget increase could be held at 15 percent. "We're under tremendous pressure," he said.

On the question of ability to pay, Mr. Adamson replied that "generally, taxpayers will take it." He admitted, however, that no one would be happy about it.

Councillor Carole Bell said most people are not inclined to complain about increases if they can see some results. Unfortunately, she said, this is not always the case.

Councillor Walter Grieve spoke out against the lowering of the pupil-teacher ratio and regional councillor Ron Moran suggested French instruction should be eliminated at the elementary level.

Cheque for \$34,634

STOUFFVILLE — The town last week received a cheque for \$35,634 to be used under the Ontario Home Renewal Program.

Interested homeowners can contact the municipal offices for applications for the funds.

The money is available, at the rate of three dollars per capita per year for the next three years, to homeowners who wish to renovate their homes to minimum standards but cannot afford to do so with their own funds.

A maximum of \$7,500 is available and depending on the applicant's income as much as \$4,000 is forgivable. The interest rates on the loan are also geared to income with a maximum rate of eight per cent and the term of the loan is 15 years with a 20 year term in special instances.

Any homeowner earning under \$12,500 is eligible for consideration. The cheque was delivered personally to Mayor Gordon Ratcliff last week by Progressive Conservative MPP William Hodgson.
