NOTICE OF APPLICATION to The Ontario Municipal Board by the Corporation of the Town of Pickering for approval of a By-law to regulate land use pursuant to Section 35 (a) of The Planning Act, R.S.O. 1970.

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Pickering intends to apply to the Ontario Municipal Board pursuant to the provisions of Section 35 (a) of The Planning Act, R.S.O. 1970, for approval of By-law 190-75 passed on the 17th day of March 1975. An explanatory note of the purpose and effect of the by-law and stating the lands affected thereby is also furnished herewith.

ANY PERSON INTERESTED MAY, within fourteen (14) days after the date of this notice, send by registered mail or deliver to the Clerk of the Town of Pickering notice of his objection to approval of the said by-law, together with a statement of the grounds of such objection.

ANY PERSON wishing to support the application for approval of the by-law may within fourteen (14) days after the date of this notice send by registered mail or deliver to the Clerk of the Town of Pickering notice of his support of approval of the said by-law together with a request for notice of any hearing that may be held giving also the name and address to which such notice should be given.

THE ONTARIO MUNICIPAL BOARD may approve of the said by-law but before doing so it may appoint a time and place when any objection to the by-law will be considered. Notice of any hearing that may be held will be given only to persons who have filed an objection or notice of support and who have left with or delivered to the Clerk undersigned, the address to which notice of hearing is to be sent. A copy of By-law 190-75 may be examined at the Office of the Clerk during business hours.

THE LAST DATE FOR FILING OBJECTIONS will be the 28th day of May, 1975.

**EXPLANATORY NOTE**  
 By-law 190-75 amends all General Restricted Area By-laws within the Town of Pickering, namely By-laws 2520, 2511, 3036 and 3037, and enables the Corporation to the Town of Pickering to exercise greater control over the form of development or redevelopment of lands within the Town. This control is implemented through the requirement that, at the Town's request, development agreements be entered into to control the form of development. Such agreements may be required on all lands with the exception of those governed by low density residential and agricultural zoning designations.
