

Dave Mintz doesn't sit around his Stouffville, Ontario, outlet waiting for the sales to pour in. When he's looking for more business he goes out and finds it.


His approach has given him a large number of commercial accounts, particularly for tire sales. It has also made him the top TBRA dealer in Gulf's Central Region.
