Land deal Students research history of town promised this week

PICKERING — Whether or not a home for a displaced home on airport property will be made public tomorrow, according to Liberal MP Norm Cafik. At a press conference on Friday he said that he hopes to have those who lost 25 acres or less to be given the same amount of land with the value upgraded from Jan. 30, 1973 to Jan. 30, 1975. Mr. Cafik said "the taxpayer will pay for this" and that "people shouldn't lose money because the land is expropriated for a public purpose." He also hopes to get the same deal for those with over 25 acres of land, but would be willing to accept the other situation as a compromise. Total cost to the government would be about \$20 to \$30 million.

STOUFFVILLE — Five area students will be seeking out facts, documents, and pictorial data to be used to compile a history of Stouffville. Entitled "Research Stouffville" the project is funded under the Opportunities for Youth grant. The group will collect the material and then turn it over to the Historical Committee to be used to publish a history of the former village. The group is headed up by Jo-Ellen Smith and Wendy Wilkes, both students at the University of Western Ontario. Three others, students at Stouffville Dist. Secondary School, are Linda Lafleur, Calvin Rae and Derek Armstrong. They will be operating out of the old Stouffville library starting the last week in June. One of the things the groups hopes to do is tape interviews with residents of the village. They plan to conduct the interviews with long-time residents. Also needed are old pictures and documents. Sports pictures, photos of the main street or any others that depict some of the village's history. Miss Smith and Miss Wilkes are already organizing the program. The group depends on people coming forward with these historical artifacts. The material will be compiled and copies made to be given to the library, as well as the historical committee. The young people plan to use files at the municipal offices and the Whitchurch - Stouffville Museum, as sources. There will also be a regular reports in The Tribune of what the group has accomplished. The five students received a grant of \$5,867 for the project.

GOODWOOD — Uxbridge council banned gravel trucks from a small stretch of road in Goodwood at their May 22 meeting. Trucks now may not turn onto Highway 1A before heading east or west on Highway 47, but instead must turn directly onto 47. The biggest problem seemed to be with those trucks coming from the north of the village, according to councillor Eleanor Todd. The trucks apparently were rumbling through the more residential area because there was a wider turn, she told The Tribune. However, she added that she later learned that the truck drivers usually respond favorably with only a reminder and the resolution may have been unnecessary.

TOWN OF MARKHAM PUBLIC NOTICE TO OPERATORS OF MOTORIZED VEHICLES

PARENTS of children operating motorized vehicles and OPERATORS of motorized vehicles in PARKS AND PUBLIC WALKWAYS are advised that under the provisions of By-Law No. 74-71 as amended of the Town of Markham it is illegal for any person to drive or operate a vehicle in Public Parks and Public Walkways in the Town of Markham as indicated in the following excerpts of the said By-Law: "NO PERSON SHALL:" 1. drive, operate, pull or ride any vehicle, except on a roadway or a parking area, in or on any part of a park. 2. travel or cause any vehicle to travel at a great speed than fifteen miles per hour on any of the roadways or parking areas of a park, or in any place so as to interfere with or endanger any person in a park. 3. drive, operate, pull or ride any vehicle upon any roadway, parking area or path in the park which is not intended to be used for said purpose, or which has any official sign showing that such roadway, parking area or path is closed to traffic. For the purposes above-mentioned a vehicle includes an automobile, motorcycle, motor scooter, mini-bike, bicycle, motorized snow vehicle, farm tractor or any other type of vehicle drawn, propelled or driven by any kind of power, including muscular power. Any person violating the provisions of By-Law No. 74-71 as amended shall, upon conviction, forfeit and pay at the discretion of the Court a penalty not exceeding \$300.00 exclusive of costs for each offence.
