STOUFFVILLE — Regional Police the rear door was forced and once inside the thief removed approximately \$200 in cash and two cartons of cigarettes. Police are continuing to investigate.

Mayor Ratcliff

More houses on Thicketwood site

STOUFFVILLE — According to Mayor Gordon Ratcliff, another 50 homes will be built in the Thicketwood subdivision, in the east end of Stouffville, "right away." The first 29 homes are now nearing completion. The mayor said nothing has been done recently on the proposed commercial development proposed for the future southern extension of Stouffer St.

Mr. Ratcliff declined to speculate when it would go forward as a rezoning will be required to permit rental apartments to be built above the commercial.

The site plan agreement is now being finalized for the shopping plaza which will be built at Main St. and the 10th. Mr. Ratcliff was optimistic this plaza, which will include a twin theatre, will be begun this summer. He said the site plan agreement will be concluded when Town

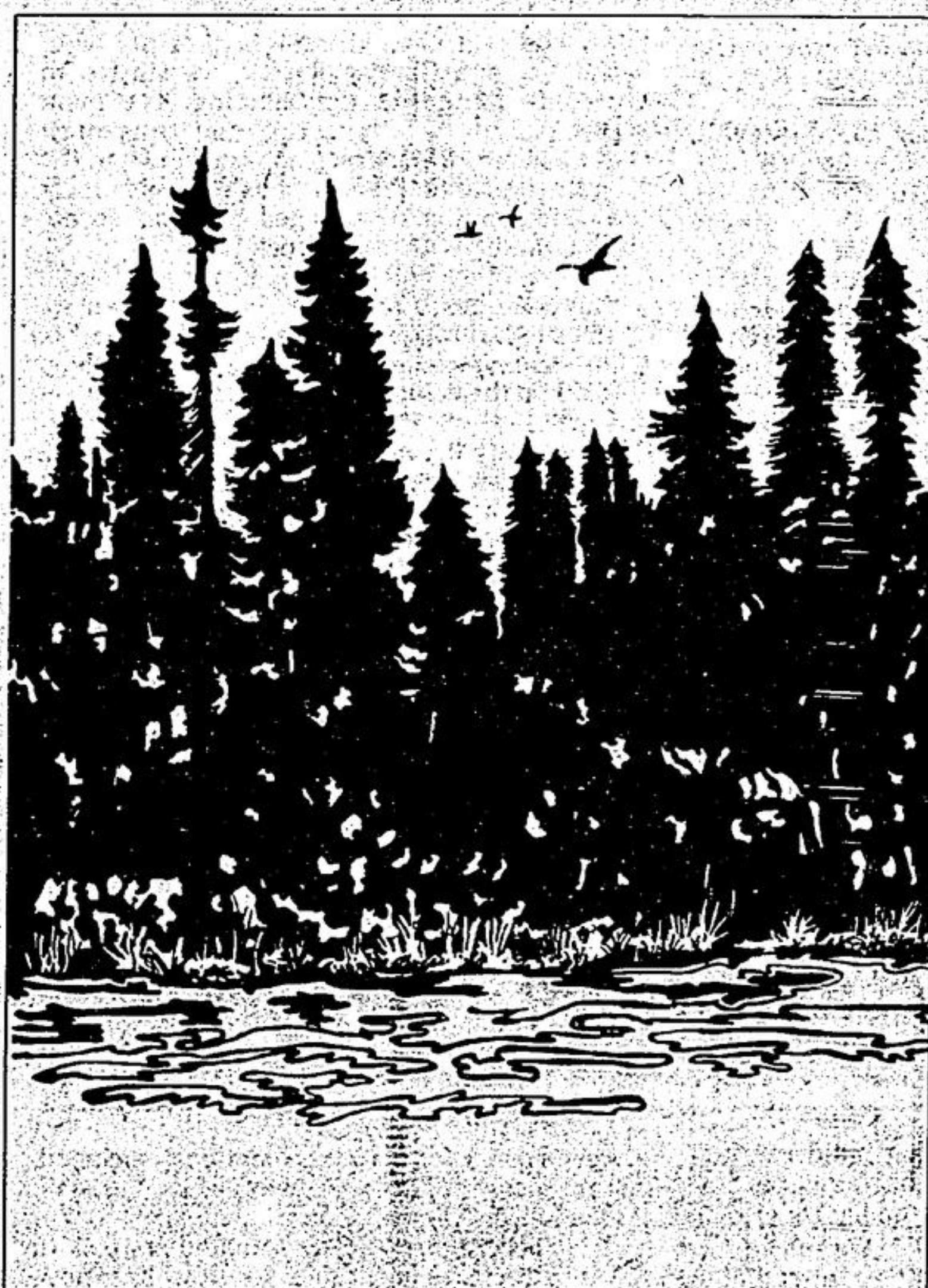

MANAGED FOREST TAX REDUCTION PROGRAM

The Ontario Government has set up a program of tax reductions on forest land. The purpose is to encourage proper management of such land, and to ensure its fullest productivity.

Qualifying forest land owners will receive grants equal to 50% of the 1973-74-75 municipal and school taxes levied on their forest property.

This program will be of interest to anyone owning forest land that is not assessed as part of a farm. It is for the relief of landowners who manage

their forests for the production of wood and wood products, and for the provision of wildlife habitat, water conservation, and prevention of erosion.
