Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville NOTICE TO HOMEOWNERS of the ONTARIO HOME RENEWAL PROGRAM

The Provincial Government has provided the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville with funds to operate the Ontario Home Renewal Program. The Program will be administered by the Town.

The purpose of the program is to assist owner occupants of residential property to repair their homes to standards which have been set by the Town and approved by the Ministry of Housing. It is particularly directed to the rehabilitation of substandard dwellings, with emphasis on faulty structural and sanitary conditions, and the up-grading of plumbing, heating and electrical systems. Additions to houses are not intended to be covered by the program.

Homeowners are eligible for assistance under the program by way of forgivable or repayable loans or both, if their "adjusted" family incomes do not exceed \$12,500.

The interest rate on the repayable portion of the loan is geared to the "adjusted" family income (50 per cent for those \$3,000 & under, up to 8 percent for those \$8,001 & over).

The amount of the forgivable portion of the loan is also geared to the "adjusted" family income (\$0 for those \$11,000 & over, up to \$4,000 for those \$6,000 & under).

The maximum amount of the loan shall not exceed \$7,500.


TOWN OF MARKHAM NOTICE TO PROPERTY OWNERS TO DESTROY WEEDS

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN to all persons in possession of land in accordance with The Weed Control Act, R.S.O. 1970, Chapter 493, that unless the noxious weeds or weed seeds growing on their lands within the Town of Markham are destroyed by Friday, June 13th, 1975, and throughout the season as often as it is necessary to prevent the ripening of their seeds and dispersal of their pollens, the Council of the Town of Markham has appointed a Weed Inspector to cause said weeds or weed seeds to be destroyed in such manner as he may deem proper, and that the expenses incurred by the said Weed Inspector in the discharge of his duties shall be placed on the Collector's Roll of the Municipality against the respective lands concerned and that such amounts shall be collected in the same manner as taxes.
