**Diamond anniversary****Commemorates happy day**

When Alberta Chrysler and William Briggs were married on July 7, 1915, at Whitewood Grove in Hilliard Township in New Ontario, there were only a cluster of houses and a school house in the tiny hamlet.

The only religious services available were visits from young students studying for the ministry. Consequently, the young couple were married at the home of Alberta's parents where the Rev. Herbert Lee of New Liskeard came to officiate at the ceremony. Last Saturday, July 5 Mr. and Mrs. Briggs celebrated their Diamond Wedding Anniversary at an Open House in the United Church Sunday School Room. The very pretty petit bride received them in a formal length peach and white

gown with a corsage of pink roses; the tall, good looking W. J. had a white carnation in his lapel.

When they were married 60 years ago there were no florists where the Briggs lived; but there were wild daisies, blooming in abundance and they were used as decoration. In memory of that long ago happy day, daisies were again used to decorate the Sunday School Room.

The Briggs lived on their farm in the north for 26 years. They came to Toronto in 1942, where Mr. Briggs was 22 years with the A. R. Clark Tannery, before moving to Scarborough. Claremont welcomed them in 1966. They were and are the best of neighbors. For years they supplied accommodation for the senior citizens, heating the hall and keeping it in good condition with no

charge at all. In Scarborough Mrs. Briggs cared for over 30 children and babies. They had seven children of their own, 28 grandchildren, 23 great-grandchildren and one great-great-grandchild.

At open house on Saturday were their immediate family — daughters Mrs. Thelma Marshall and son Timothy of Dartmouth N.S. Ruby and son-in-law Henry Velej and family of Arden Ontario; Ila and son-in-law Jack Winterburn and family of Bramalea; Doris and son-in-law Metro Holodniuk and family of Canfield; Sons Russel and Thomas Briggs and family both of Scarborough and grandsons Ivan Porter and family of Arden and Harvey Porter and family of Lindsay. Daughter, Rita, Mrs. George Jones of

Goodwood died two years ago.

Mr. and Mrs. Briggs were delighted with the Letter of Congratulation from Queen Elizabeth and one from Premier Bill Davis who sent them a plaque. They were also the recipients of a plaque from Prime Minister Pierre Trudeau.
