Consider work for subsidy

YORK REGION — Provincial controls on school spending may be completely removed next year, according to York County education board negotiations chairman Craig Cribar.

The Newmarket trustee made his comments in response to an attack by the Thornhill Parents' Council over the settlement made by the board with District II of the Ontario Secondary School Teachers' Federation.

Mr. Cribar said the Ontario Ministry of Education may totally remove spending ceilings next year. The Parents' Council was concerned that the settlement might puncture the ceilings.

The council has also launched a survey to see whether any trustees were members, or have spouses who were members, of the OSSTF at the time of the wage settlement in June.

Ceilings may be lifted

YORK REGION — York regional council is considering a recommendation that welfare recipients should work for their subsidy. The Durham Region recommendation suggests that union wages would be provided for welfare recipients.

If a recipient received \$60 weekly and the union rate were \$5 an hour, the individual would be required to work 12 hours per week.

Markham councillor Alma Walker told the York Region health and service committee that that kind of program was practiced during the depression.
