Markham contributed 12 hits to the fireworks, including a home run by leftfielder Dunsford.

At the Rupert park, Burlington and London clash at 10 a.m. with other games starting at 11:30 a.m., 1 p.m. and 3 p.m.

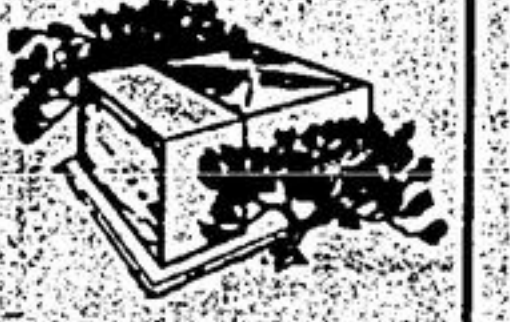
Mongolia tourney
