## Police to enforce noise, truck bylaws

**MARKHAM** — York Regional Police will enforce anti-noise and truck bylaws in the Town of Markham at the request of Markham Council.

In a letter to the Regional Police Commission last Wednesday Diane E. Whetter, deputy clerk of the municipality, told the board that the town is concerned that strict enforcement of the anti-noise and "no heavy truck" bylaws has not been carried out. "It has become a problem," Markham Mayor Tony

Roman told the Commission.

Mayor Roman, who also serves on the commission, said increases in traffic and other associated problems are creating a need for stricter enforcement of bylaws in the Town.

"The claim that the bylaws are not being enforced, is not totally accurate," Chief Bruce Crawford told the board regarding the Markham request. "I have already issued orders to step up enforcement."

## Youth guilty after coin meter found

**MARKHAM** — A young Markham area youth pleaded guilty to possession a drop coin meter when he appeared in Newmarket Provincial Court last week before Judge Clare Morrison.

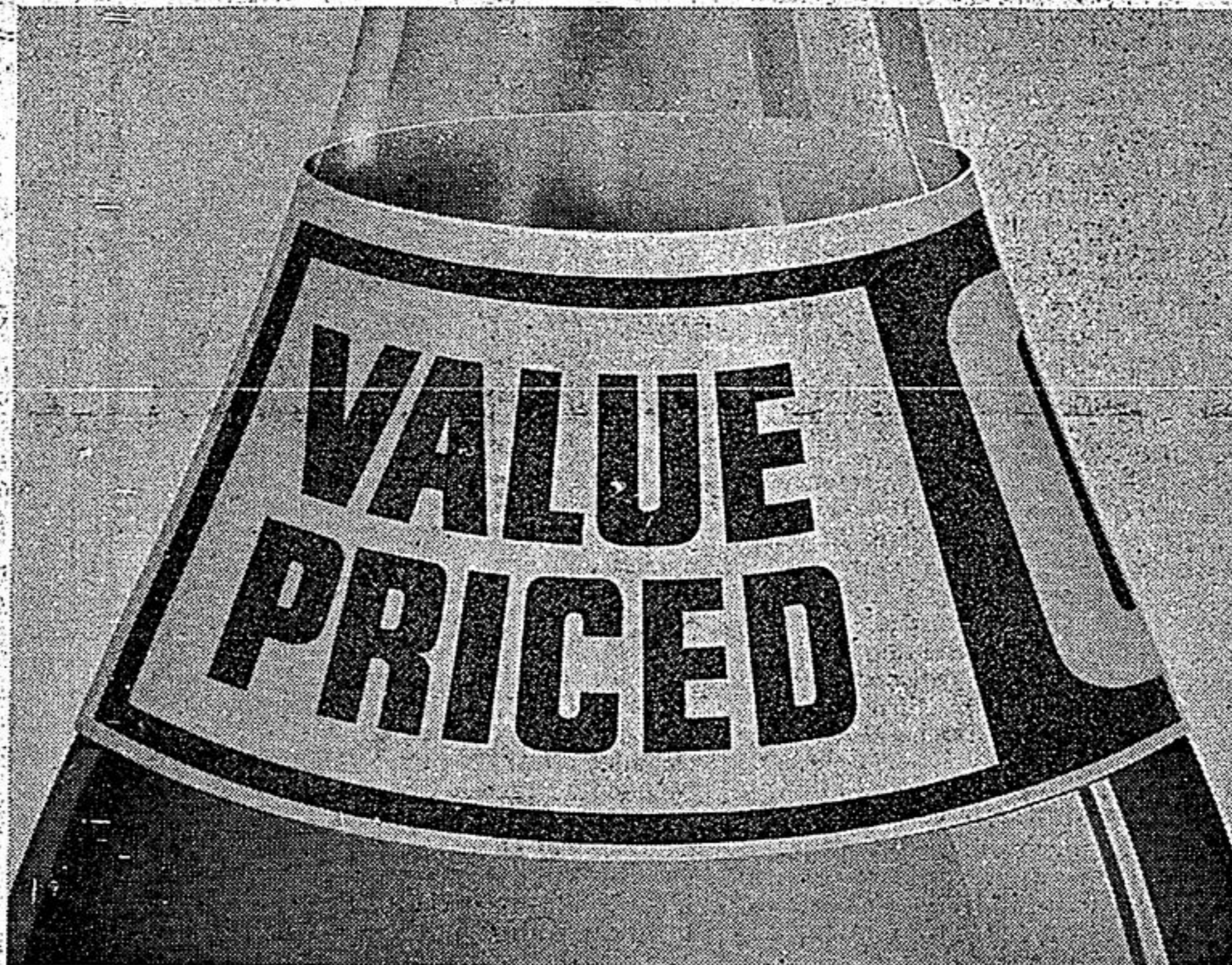
Brian Anthony Kavanagh was charged Feb. 25 by York Regional Police after they found the meter, stolen from a car wash, under the

Judge Morrison granted Kavanagh a conditional discharge and ordered him on one year's probation.
