## 90th birthday for former assessor

STOUFFVILLE — "I never thought I'd live to see 90", Edwin R. Good, told The Tribune, just a few days before a family gathering to mark his 90th birthday.

Still active, Mr. Good lives in his own apartment on Baker Ave., and manages to walk downtown at least once a week.

Edwin Good was born on Aug. 21, 1885 at Conestoga, Ontario, a town about eight miles north of Kitchener. When he dies Mr. Good will be buried in that town.

He was the son of Henry and Sarah Good, one of 12 children. His father was a blacksmith. After some years in Kitchener, the depression hit and he and his wife Myrtle decided to make a fresh start in Stouffville.

They came to town in 1932. Mrs. Good was a registered nurse, and the couple decided to establish a nursing home. It was located for eight months on Church St. and then moved to the east end.

It became Brierbush Hospital and grew from four beds to 25 in the 12 years the Goods were proprietors. Three additions were added in those years and the staff rose to five.

In 1946, Mr. Good took on the job of village assessor for the princely sum of \$150 per year, then had a similar position with the Village of Markham. He stayed there 11 years.

Meanwhile the Goods bought the house at the corner of Baker Ave. and Main St. Mr. Good holds an honorary life membership in the York County Assessment Association and enjoys painting, jig-saw puzzles. He also likes to read the Bible.

He is a member of the Stouffville Missionary Church. The family gathering was held at the Canadiana Hotel in Scarborough. At the dinner, his son Edward Good of Waterloo presented him with a plaque from Premier William Davis and a certificate from the federal government.

He is proud to say that there are 50 people in his family including himself and his descendants. Children include Helen (Mrs. Gordon Hall), Edward, Harold, Garth, Evelyn (Mrs. Charles Mackechnie), Ruby, Audrey (Mrs. Robert Clyde), and Lois (Mrs. Cecil Titus). There are 17 grandchildren and 11 great grandchildren.

His son Edward is MPP for the riding of Waterloo North.


