P.M. to open world match

BROOKLIN — Prime Minister Pierre Trudeau will open the International and World and Canadian Plowing Championships to be held near here Sept. 23. The championship is expected to draw more than 150,000 people to Durham Region for the week-long match. Mr. Trudeau will also take part in the opening day parade. Eugene Whelan, minister of agriculture, will speak at the closing banquet on Sept. 26.

Tent taken at Bruce's Mill

STOUFFVILLE — Warm weather and vacations appear to have encouraged a variety of minor occurrences in the area, with petty theft being the most common crime reported to York Regional Police.

Tent stolen  
A yellow and blue tent owned by Camp Maple Grove of Willowdale was stolen in Bruce's Mill Conservation Area the night of August 14.

Vandalism  
Unionville was the scene of two cases of vandalism recently. Youths aged 11, 12 and 12 were accused of breaking into the home of Richard Wilcox, R. R. 1 on August 10, and causing \$1,000 in damage. Furniture was damaged, and paint was splashed on the walls. The youths will make an August 28 appearance in juvenile court.

On August 15, three large pieces of wood were

thrown through two large plate glass windows on the north side of Parkview Public School. Windows in the nearby door were also broken. Damage is estimated at \$300.

Canoe taken  
A fibre glass canoe valued at \$200 was taken from the pond at the home of Edward Howes, R. R. 4, Stouffville on August 11. Two paddles were also stolen.

Scraped blade  
Sometime between August 8 and 11, a six-foot scraper blade was taken from a tractor parked behind Rainbow Marine Supplies, Highway 47, Markham. The blade was worth \$147.

Tents heisted  
Two tents, valued at \$500 together, were stolen from the Town of Markham recently. Damage to a Marquis worth \$500 also occurred on the Don Mills Road premises.

Patrick Motors  
Nothing was taken the night of August 13 at Neil Patrick Motors, Stouffville, when it was broken into. A bay door was smashed and stepped through in order to enter.

Truck break-in  
James Sweet of Conc. 7, Whitechurch, Stouffville, had \$298 in items taken from his truck on August 14. The truck was parked near his home on lot 9 at the time.

Rev. John Russell

New pastor has wide experience

STOUFFVILLE — Although World War II kept Rev. John Russell from becoming a missionary in Africa, he managed to serve the mission fields very well at home.

He is the interim pastor at Stouffville Memorial Christian Church.

Born in Toronto, Mr. Russell worked for the Toronto Evening Telegram for 16 years. He graduated from Ontario Bible College in 1939, fully intending to join the Sudan United Mission.

The war prevented that and in 1941 he was ordained. He served as pastor at Christie St. Baptist Church and was the founder of Dawes Rd. Gospel Church. Rev. Russell is a former vice-president of the Toronto Gideon's and former vice-president of the fun-

damentalist Baptist young people's association.

He worked as home director of missions for 20 years and visited Africa three times, travelling more than 10,000 miles of that continent.

Rev. Russell was instrumental in the merger of the Sudan United Mission and the Evangelical Alliance in 1969 and had organized the United States branch of the SUM.

He has been semi-retired since 1972 and lives near Lindsay. His work includes special representative of the Evangelical Alliance Mission.

When David Barker resigned as pastor at the Memorial Church earlier this year, Mr. Russell agreed to become interim pastor.

He is in Stouffville from Friday to Monday each week.

In a letter to The Tribune some weeks ago, Mr. Russell took exception to a column by Howard Minaker, which appeared in the July 24 issue which mentioned "speaking in tongues."

Mr. Russell takes exception to his mention of "old line denominationalist," adding that tongues "may seem beneficial to the participant, but it is not necessary for God's blessing, rather it tends to confuse and divide Christians."

"I can name more, more great preachers and missionaries who never had the 'speaking in tongues' experience but were continually filled with the spirit than our brother can name who have," he added.
