Broken windows reported at area schools

YORK REGION
 Three separate cases of window-breaking in Markham-Unionville area schools were reported by York Regional Police last week, with damage totalling over \$2,000.

About \$900 damage resulted from a rock being thrown through two five by nine-foot library windows at Markham District High School. The incident occurred August 14 or 15. Another \$1000 in damage was inflicted at M.D.H.S. August 20 or 21 when three more windows were broken.

At Mark Two school in Unionville over the weekend, four nine by 12-inch panes of glass were smashed, resulting in \$160 damage.

Other incidents reported by the police follow.

Thornhill murder
 The body of Tracy Lynn Kundering, 18, of Thornhill, was found August 12 at a field behind German Mills Public School in Markham. The cause of death is under investigation.

Hub cap theft
 Three hub caps, valued at \$180 were stolen from the car of John Houston, Glen Gail Street, Stouffville on August 20. The car was parked near Main Street at the time.

Mini-bike taken
 A Honda All-Terrain mini-cycle was taken August 19 from the home of Peter Marmi of Billy Joel Crescent, Markham. The bike was taken from an unlocked garage and worth \$480.

Tapes swiped
 Thirteen stereo tapes, along with a white tape case and tape head cleaner, were stolen from the car of Keith Lewis, William Street, recently. Total value was \$115.

Vivian vandalism
 Vandals broke two lamps outside the home of Arthur Stracion, lot 31 Vivian side-road, on August 23. The lamps were worth about \$100 each.

Self-stabbing
 Philip Nichols, 17, of Thornhill was charged with public mischief last week after an incident involving his estranged wife and her boyfriend. Police said Nichols went to their apartment and got into a fight with the boyfriend, then returned home when the police were called. Two hours later he called the police to report that he had been stabbed, but under question later admitted he had stabbed himself.

The wound in his left forearm required 18 stitches.

Thornhill fire
 The cause remains undetermined for a fire at the apartment of Cathy Larson of Clark Street, Thornhill on August 23. The fire, in her bedroom resulted in \$2000 damage.

Councillor irked over complaints

STOUFFVILLE
 Councillor June Button is getting a little tired of hearing about problems with the town's recently instituted garbage pickup.

At the conclusion of a recent Planning Committee meeting, Mrs. Button revealed that she had been called to the telephone during the meeting by a local resident. The complaint involved the failure of the town contractor to pick up garbage.

"He says he's going to bring it down here for us to take care of," said councillor Button. "I don't know what we can do. It's getting ridiculous, the number of complaints we're getting over this."

Other councillors appeared to agree, and passed a motion by councillor Cathy Joyce that the town Administrator be asked to look into the complaint and take remedial action.
