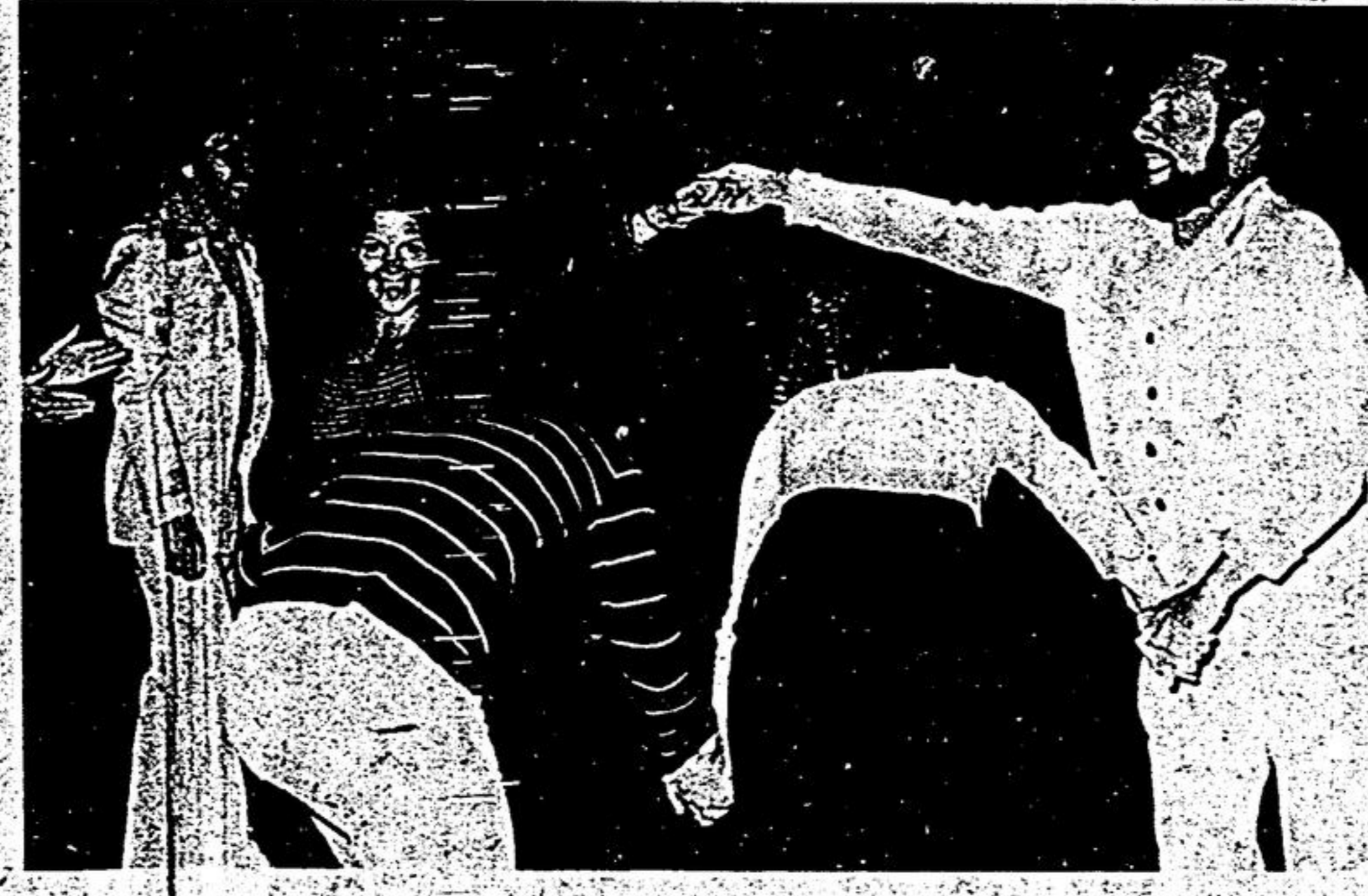

Service station owner wins SSC food lottery

STOUFFVILLE — A \$750 food voucher, first prize in the Save Stouffville Committee's food lottery, was won by Mickey Hunt of Hunt's Sunoco, 345 Main Street.

At various times during the evening, all three candidates in York North Progressive Conservative incumbent Bill Hodgson, Mrs. Britnell and Mr. Lewis were in attendance.
