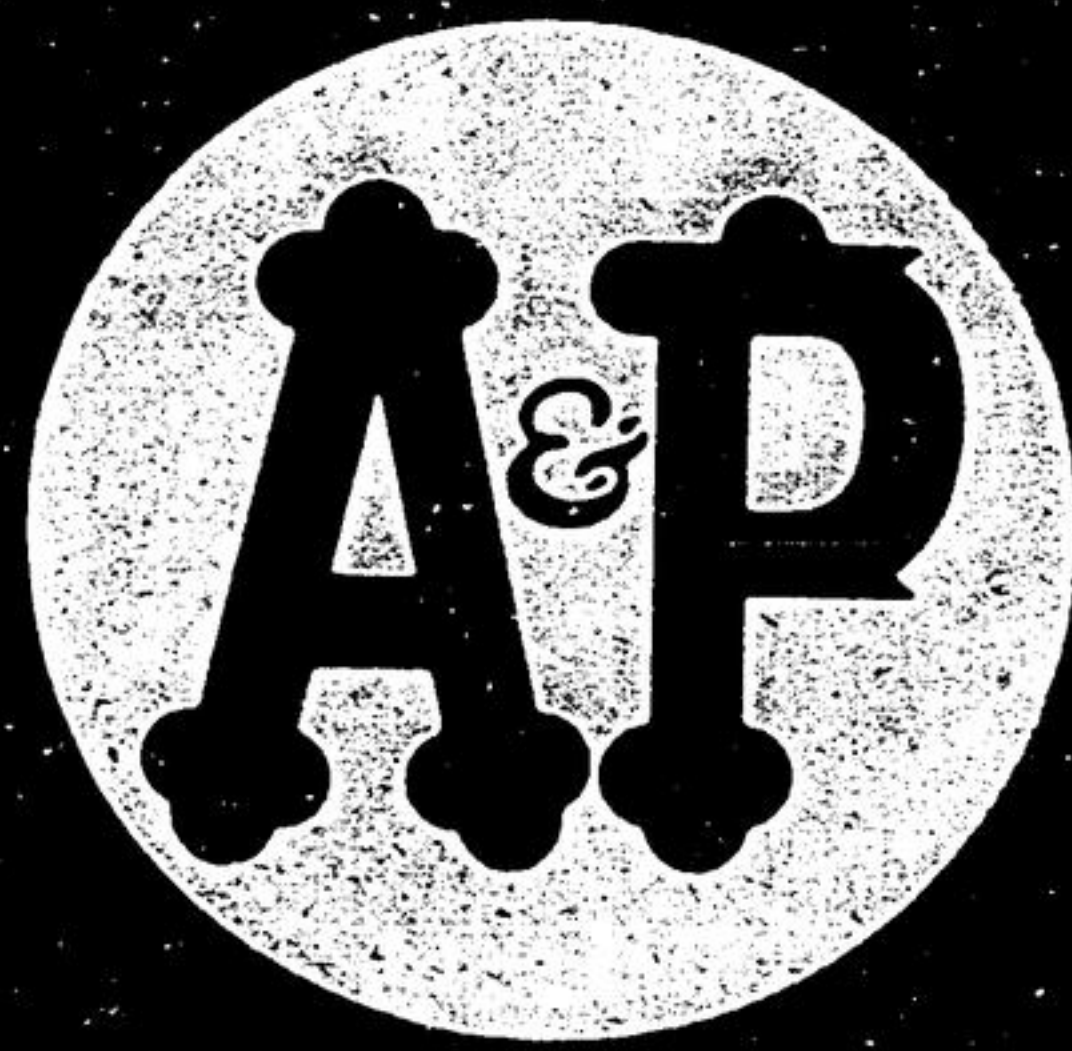

Legal advice sought on rail change

PICKERING — The Town of Pickering is seeking legal advice on its rights regarding the proposed relocation of the Canadian Pacific Railway line.

Because of the location of the proposed Pickering airport, land will have to be expropriated to relocate the line. In the meeting of council last week, opinion differed as to what say the town had in the expropriation procedures.

Town clerk administrator Noel Marshall told council that when he contacted the railway commission about the matter, the person he talked with there said he doubted that the municipality had final say in the matter. The commission representative added, however, that the municipality or a private individual could seek a hearing before the commission, Mr. Marshall said.

Councillor Ken Spratley cited a magazine on municipal affairs that said railroads couldn't relocate without the town's permission, and Councillor Don Kitchen said that in another move several years ago, the railway went out of its way to get the town's permission.

Talking to The Tribune later, Councillor Jack Anderson said he doubted that the railway would "choose to effect the ninth concession east of Clarendon." He added that he didn't think that "people in Clarendon want to lose their commuter service."

Since he himself is a railway employee, Mr. Anderson said that for the most part he "keeps out of" discussion of the subject.

Ward changes up-set rural councillor

PICKERING — Councillor Jack Anderson is unhappy with a shuffle in ward boundaries approved last week by town council. He fears the switch "takes away the power from the rural areas."

The redistribution is designed to allow all wards to have a projected population of 13,000 by 1977. But to accomplish that, the two northern rural ridings represented by Mr. Anderson and Ken Spratley — will have some urban areas incorporated within them.

According to Mayor George Ashe, the change is necessary to make the numbers within the wards balance. The only other solution, in the view of Councillor Ken Kitchen, would be to create another two wards and add to the number of councillors.

Councillor Spratley expressed the fear that Pickering Township, a rural area, would be left without true representation as new subdivisions began moving in.

Markham man fined in 'mishap'

MARKHAM — A 17 year old Markham youth who pleaded guilty to failing to remain at the scene of an accident, was fined \$150 or seven days after Judge Ian Munroe heard police testify that the youth had caused \$5,000 damage to a Markham Parks and Recreation building, and two cars, June 14.

John D. Liederman was charged after smacking into the building then plowing into two cars which were near as he ricocheted back onto the road.

Liederman's counsel told the court, "He must have fallen asleep at the wheel of his car, he doesn't drink." He added that the youth only had a learners permit to drive.

Judge Munroe told the youth that the severity of the accident warranted a suspension of one year for any application to drive.
