No new evidence in murder

THORNHILL — There is no new evidence in the strangulation murder of 18 year old Tracy Lynn Kundinger but police are hopeful release of a composite photo of a male suspect will lead to the man's identification and apprehension.

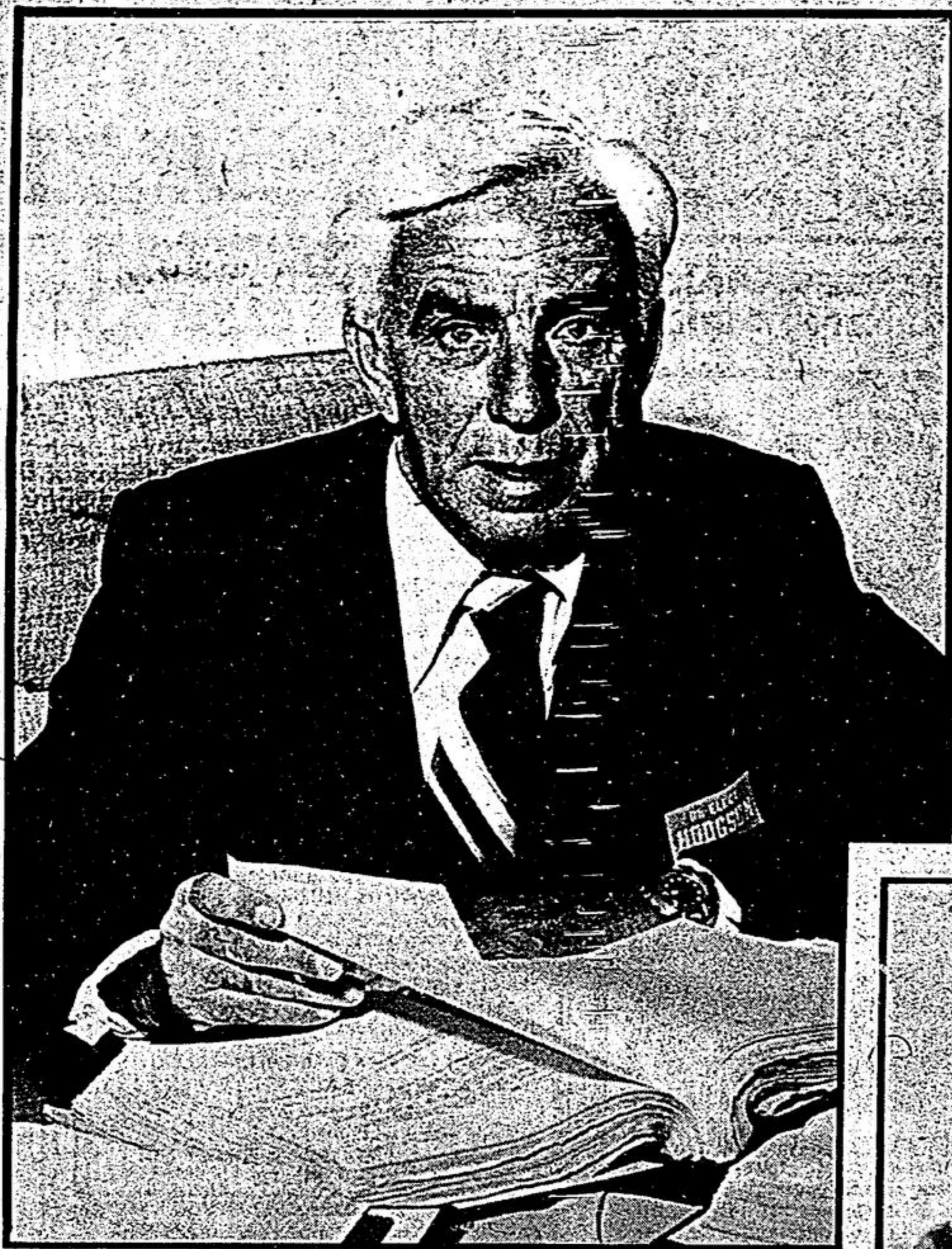
Miss Kundinger's body was discovered August 21 in a park at the rear of German Mills Public School on Simonston Boulevard.

The only suspect is an unidentified male who is reported to have left the Don Mills bus at the same stop as Miss Kundinger, a Monsanto Court resident.

She was last seen alive when she left the bus at 10:50 p.m., Aug. 20, at Don Mills and Steeles Ave. She was returning home after working that evening as a lifeguard at the St. Jamestown swimming pool.

York Regional police have offered a \$5,000 reward for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the guilty party or parties.

The male suspect is described as between 22 and 26 years of age, with light to medium brown hair, collar length at the back, and as having a thick, muscular neck. The suspect is believed to have been wearing beige or light colored matching jacket and pants on the night of the murder.



Cottage break-in nets \$350 for thieves

MUSS LAKE — Sometime between Aug. 31 and Sept. 6 a cottage on the 9th conc. at Musselman's Lake was entered by forcing the rear window and an estimated \$350 worth of goods were stolen. Included were a television and radio. The cottage is owned by George Tyndale of Toronto.

Chicken barn hit — The farmhouse and chicken barn of Erle Reesor, Lot 6, Conc. 6, were broken into last Friday morning. Mr. Reesor's brother saw two youths in the area at the time and one was recognized. Damage is estimated at \$205.

Break-in — The home of Albert Moorby, Bethesda Sideroad, Gormley, was broken into last week. The house was entered by smashing a rear window with a brick. A portable television, a purse containing \$25 and an unknown quantity of jewellery were taken.

Assault charge — As a result of an altercation at St. Andrew's College in Aurora, Mark Saunders, Pheasant Valley Cres., Markham, sustained a broken nose and had several teeth damaged. Charged with assault causing bodily harm is 17 year old Grant Overton of St. Andrew's. Mr. Overton was arrested and released to appear in court Sept. 30.

Fraud charge — Allan Read, 24, of Etobicoke has been charged with fraud. According to police Mr. Read leased a 1975 Cougar from Gateway Motors, Yonge St. It is alleged he represented himself as an agent of Zest Furniture when he leased the vehicle. The car was taken and no payments were made. When the bill reached \$337 the company became suspicious and on investigation they learned the accused had no authorization from the furniture store to lease the vehicle. Mr. Read was arrested Sept. 2.

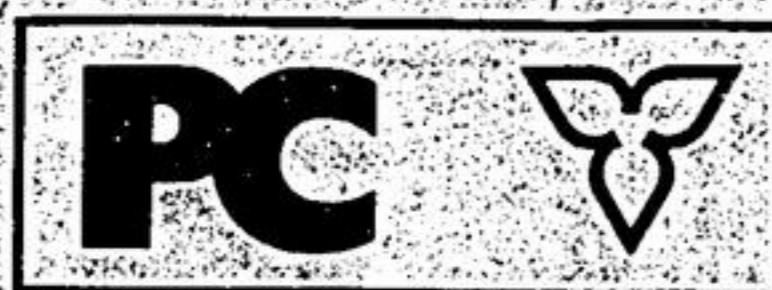
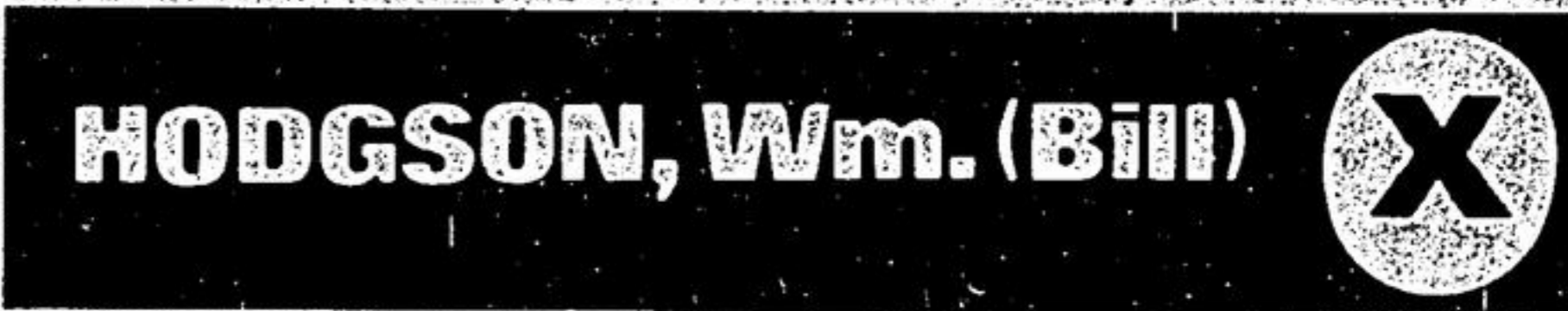
