

Farm land issue raised by report

YORK REGION — A Committee report presented to York Regional Council. The Don Mills industrial zone committee suggested the amendment be approved but reduced the size of the preservation of farmland development and limited in the region last week. It is further pending an amendment for the land treatment capacity.

An addendum to the

recommendation drew fire from Markham Mayor Tony Roman. It stated that the committee had no choice but to approve the amendment because of the "lack of a provincial policy directed toward the protection of prime agricultural land."

Mayor Roman in-

sisted that the area is a logical extension of an existing industrial use and that despite "inconsistencies" in the provincial government's policy, the industrial zone was meant to expand.

Councillor Bob

Adams said that Markham finds itself in

the position of having prime agricultural land in the south but is designated for urban development under the Toronto Centred Region Plan.

He insisted that attempts to leave land agricultural are thwarted. He cited the proposed Milliken Mills proposal which has been advocated by Housing Minister Donald Irvine under his Ontario Housing Action Program.
