Another Booth Drive resident, Mary King said she liked Stouffville and

that it has "very friendly people."

She added however, that when they were unable to have a phone installed, she was "absolutely shattered. I didn't think it could happen in Canada."

Mrs. King and her husband have recently moved from England.

As for another newcomer, Mrs. John Harrison, she too is pleased with her new location. They moved, she said, "for the simple reason we wanted to get out of Toronto; we liked the area out here."

Not having a phone, she said, was especially worrisome to some of the younger women living in the subdivision.

Mrs. Gyton said people in the new subdivision have gotten to

know one another well in the short time it has been in existence. Her family's reason for coming here was that they "like a small town atmosphere," and the price on the house "was right."

She and her husband have already both joined bowling leagues in town already. They moved in six weeks ago.

Because of the lack of phones in the subdivision, a special arrangement has been made with Summitview School when a child living in the subdivision is sick. Now, instead of phoning, the child is taken home personally by someone at the school.

Bell Canada has installed a telephone booth in the subdivision so that residents can still make outside calls.

## SDSS Guidance News

### Career information

What is SGIS? The initials stand for Student Guidance Information System. This system is maintained by the Department of Education in Toronto and involves the maintenance of reasonably complete and up-to-date information on literally thousands of careers as well as information on all opportunities for education in Ontario outside of the high schools including apprenticeship, community colleges, universities, and private trade schools. Information regarding educational and training opportunities outside of the province is gradually being added.

The Student Guidance Information System was put into operation at Queen's Park about three years ago. Two years ago students taking the Career Development Course at SDSS were enrolled on this program. Last year all students were given the opportunity to join and again this year any student at SDSS who pays a nominal fee of \$1 will be enrolled.

The system is very easy to use. Three sets of booklets will be kept at the school. One booklet contains an alphabetical list of all of the careers about which information

is available. A second booklet will list all of the institutions of further education along with specific programs at these institutions. A third booklet enables a student to obtain a list of careers to match his interests and educational aspirations.

This facility is very useful for students who are undecided regarding career plans. A student merely selects the code number from the appropriate booklet for the information he seeks and presents this to Mrs. Glenn, the Guidance secretary. A computer printout of the information requested will then be made available to

the student — usually within four days. This information is for the student to keep and there is no limit on the number of requests that an individual student may make.

Certainly this service provided by the Department of Education is an extremely valuable one, and students of SDSS are urged to enroll immediately. Further information may be obtained from the Guidance Department at the High School, 640-1433.
