Nov. 12 - Walt Disney - Def. 10 - Madeline, Red Balloon, Ring Tail, and Rosie's Walk.


Dec. 17 - The Night Before Christmas, Christmas Fantasy, Christmas Toy Shop, and Christmas Visitor.

Another Booth Drive resident, Mary King said she liked Stouffville and

that it has "very friendly people."

She added however, that when they were unable to have a phone installed, she was "absolutely shattered. I didn't think it could happen in Canada."

Mrs. King and her husband have recently moved from England.

As for another newcomer, Mrs. John Harrison, she too is pleased with her new location. They moved, she said, "for the simple reason we wanted to get out of Toronto; we liked the area out here."

Not having a phone, she said, was especially worrisome to some of the younger women living in the subdivision.

Mrs. Gyton said people in the new subdivision have gotten

know one another well in the short time it has been in existence. Her family's reason for coming here was that they like a small town atmosphere, and the price on the house "was right."

She and her husband have already both joined bowling leagues in town already. They moved in six weeks ago.

Because of the lack of phones in the subdivision, a special arrangement has been made with Sunniview School when a child living in the subdivision is sick. Now, instead of phoning, the child is taken home personally by someone at the school.

Bell Canada has installed a telephone booth in the subdivision so that residents can still make outside calls.


