Region wants airport built

NEWMARKET — Now that the Pickering airport has been cancelled, some proponents of the airport are calling for a reconsideration of the project.

York regional engineering committee voted last week to ask the province to provide services for the airport. The only dissenter was Mayor Marg Britnell of King Township, who said she felt the airport would contribute to "urban sprawl."

Meanwhile, regional planning committee came to a 3-3 stalemate on a resolution by Markham Councillor Bob Adams supporting the federal decision to halt the airport.

Recently, Durham Regional council commissioned a study to be done to determine the

economic impact of the airport's cancellation on Durham Region. It is to indicate what comparable impetus would be necessary to replace the project.

Uxbridge council has sent a resolution to appropriate authorities, federal and provincial, asking that they proceed with the airport as planned. In March of this year, the municipality sent a resolution asking the federal government to delay the airport until an accurate map of noislands was produced.

According to York Regional planning commissioner Murray Pount, cancellation of the airport will further slow down discussion of the nine development alternatives being considered for the region's official plan.

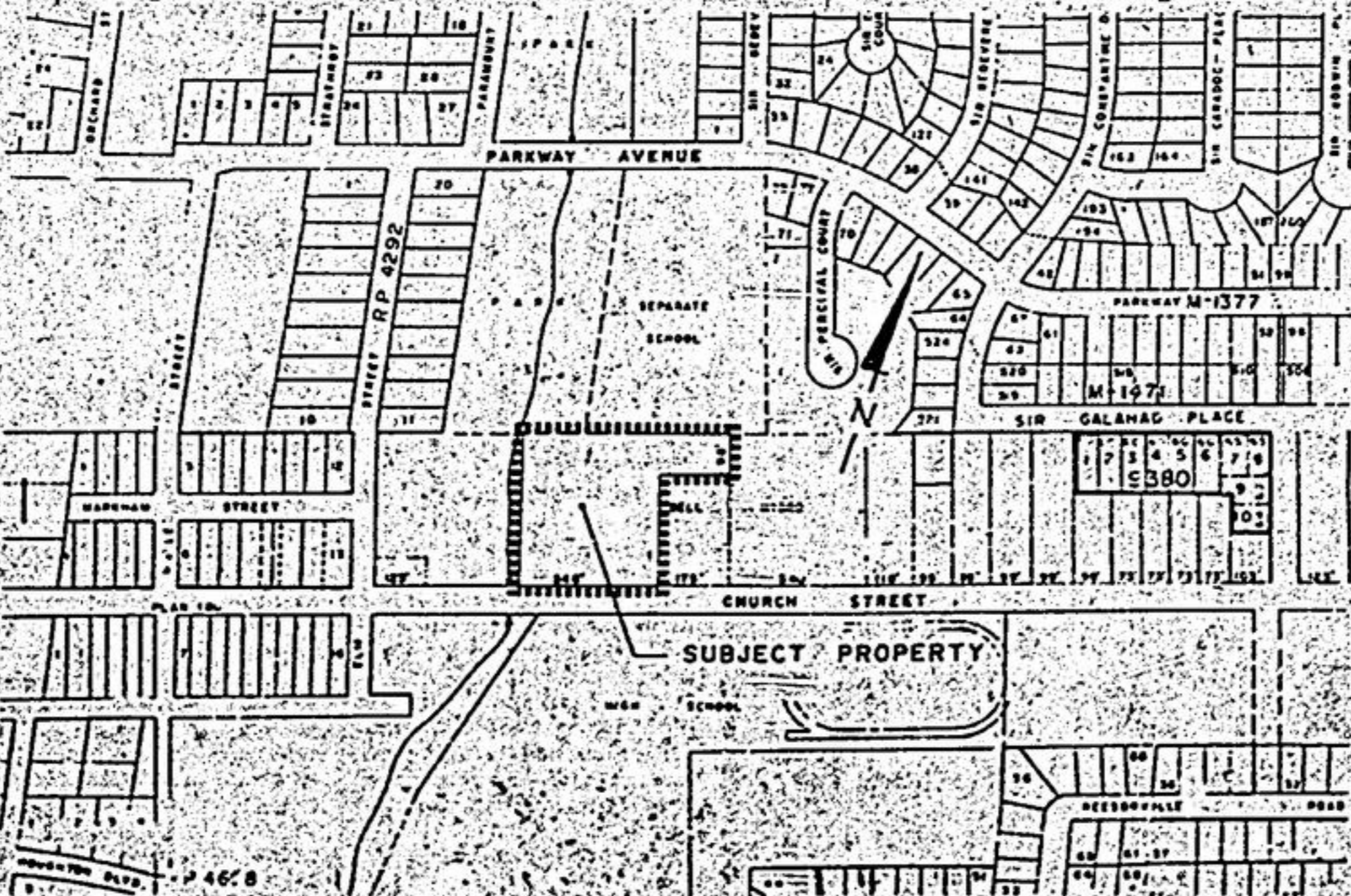
