

### Stouffville golfers lose Ontario tourney

STOUFFVILLE — SDSS golfers were disappointed by their performance recently in the All-Ontario tournament in Bolton. Their scores were: Mike Kamps, 83; Craig Waite, 84; Dave Huxtable, 88; Randy Wood, 88.
