### Local postal workers return after short strike

STOUFFVILLE — Stouffville Post Office was back to full staff Tuesday morning after four striking workers voted Monday night to end the week-old walkout.

Four of the six workers manned the picket lines last week. The other two, who are not card-carrying members of the union, reported to work as usual.

Pickers told The Tribune that working conditions and fringe benefits were their reasons for striking. They agreed that the government wage offer was acceptable.

With the resolution of all but money matters this week, the four local workers felt there was no further reason to strike.

"The door was always open," Postmaster Gary Fisher told The Tribune.

## Former councillor speaks out Modest pool project urged

MARKHAM — Former Markham Councillor Ron Moran has made known his opposition to the proposed scale and financing of the pool and health facility to be built on McCowan Road.

In a letter to The Tribune Mr. Moran pointed out that "the \$5 million Thornhill Community Centre received financial support from the Thornhill Lions and residents in the amount of \$250,000, or 5 percent of the cost; when the Crosby Arena was expanded in Unionville, residents and businesses donated over \$71,000, which is about 22 percent of the \$328,000 price tag — We are now advised that the council is looking to the Markham-Unionville Lions, as well as other service organizations and citizens, to raise \$400,000, or 40 percent of the one million dollar price."

"Why the difference?" asks Mr. Moran. "The method of financing of such projects should be uniform in their application, no matter where they are built in Markham."

Mr. Moran suggests council determine whether the project is needed and whether it can be afforded and he goes on to suggest that if it is to be built then it should be part of the current levy or be debentured.

His own opinion is that the project should be scaled down to just a 25-metre pool with a small training pool and that the health facility be cancelled. He said this would result in nearly halving the costs.

### 5-hour limit posted

STOUFFVILLE — Signs warning that night parking in winter is restricted to five hours will be posted at both ends of town.

Council passed a resolution to that affect on the recommendation of Public Works Committee.

According to Works Chairman Mervyn Baker the five hour restriction is necessary so streets can be plowed.

### Local autonomy sought in naming

YORK REGION — "They should leave us a bit of dignity", an angry Alma Walker snorted at Thursday's regional council meeting.

Mrs. Walker, councillor from Markham, was objecting to a clause in a planning committee recommendation stating that streets in a proposed subdivision would be named to the satisfaction of the Town of Markham and the regional planning department.

"Why do we have to have the approval of the region to name our own streets?" Mrs. Walker questioned. "The region has no business in the Town of Markham street names."

Regional chairman Garfield Wright maintained that the planning department was not trying to take power away from Markham; Regional approval was needed to avoid confusion and duplication of names, he said.

### Armed robbery at barber shop

THORNHILL — A hairstylist was robbed at gunpoint in Thornhill last Saturday afternoon.

Joseph Men's Hairstylists, Royal Orchard Boulevard, was entered about 10 minutes before seven, after all the customers had left.
