according to postmaster Larry Ross, pictured above, is "trying to put the time in." The post office remains open, handling local mail and answering any inquiries, he said.

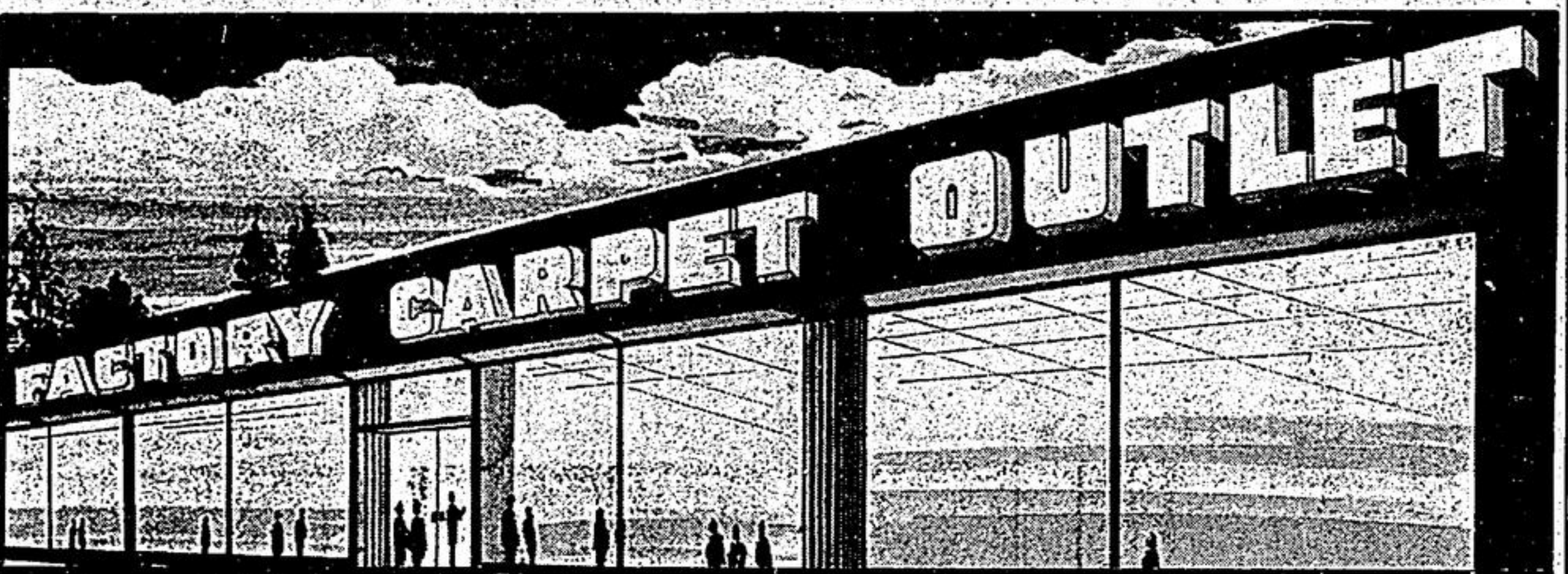
