## Ivan Norton tops world rye class at the Royal

**GOODWOOD** — Ivan Norton was declared world champion in the rye section at the Royal Winter Fair last week. It is the second year in a row that Mr. Norton captured the title.

Other local entries fared well in the field crop competitions at The Royal. Mrs. Norton told The Tribune that seed from one crop may be used two years in a row, but the Nortons used part of their 1975 crop.

She said that the kernels were larger than the 1974 sample, although, "the color wasn't as good."

The Nortons managed to pick up other awards. Lillie Norton topped the carrot competitions with her husband reserve champion. They took a total of one 2nd, two 3rds and three 4ths in the potato section.

Albert Hockley of R. R. 1, Claremont, topped the commercial potato field, with Mr. Norton second. Ivan Norton had taken that championship last year.

Grant Davidson of R. R. 1, Stouffville was also a big local winner. He fared well in the 4H competitions with a first for oats and a first for 2-rowed barley. He also took the reserve world championship in the barley section.

## Local artist has library showing

STOUFFVILLE — Thirty-six works of art by local artist Charles Creasey are featured at the Whitchurch - Stouffville Public Library throughout the month of November.

Mr. Creasey of Millard St., Stouffville, is a commercial artist by trade, and painting is a hobby. He attended art school in England and started out sketching local scenes in that country.

He also worked as an art dealer and later as commercial artist. He is presently employed with Sears in their retail advertising department.

He came to Canada in 1956 after having served with the British Army in Burma and the Far East during World War II. His other claim to fame is that he is the nephew of the late mystery and crime novelist John Creasey.

Mr. Creasey enjoys rural scenes and hopes to use various scenes in the Stouffville area as subjects. He has lived in town just over a year.

Although painting is a hobby, he has sold a number of pictures and has exhibited at the Markham Centennial Library and the Markham Kiwanis Club Art Show. The 36 works at the Whitchurch-Stouffville library include paintings and sketches.
