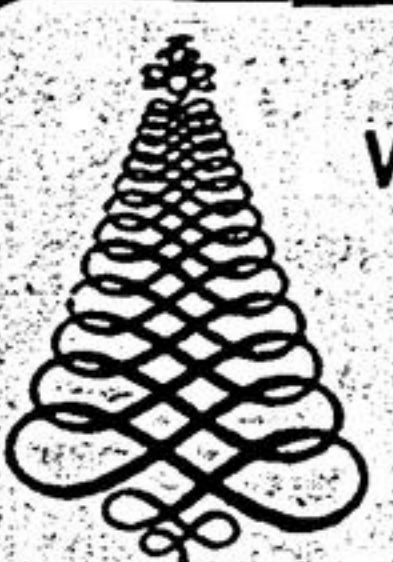

holiday.

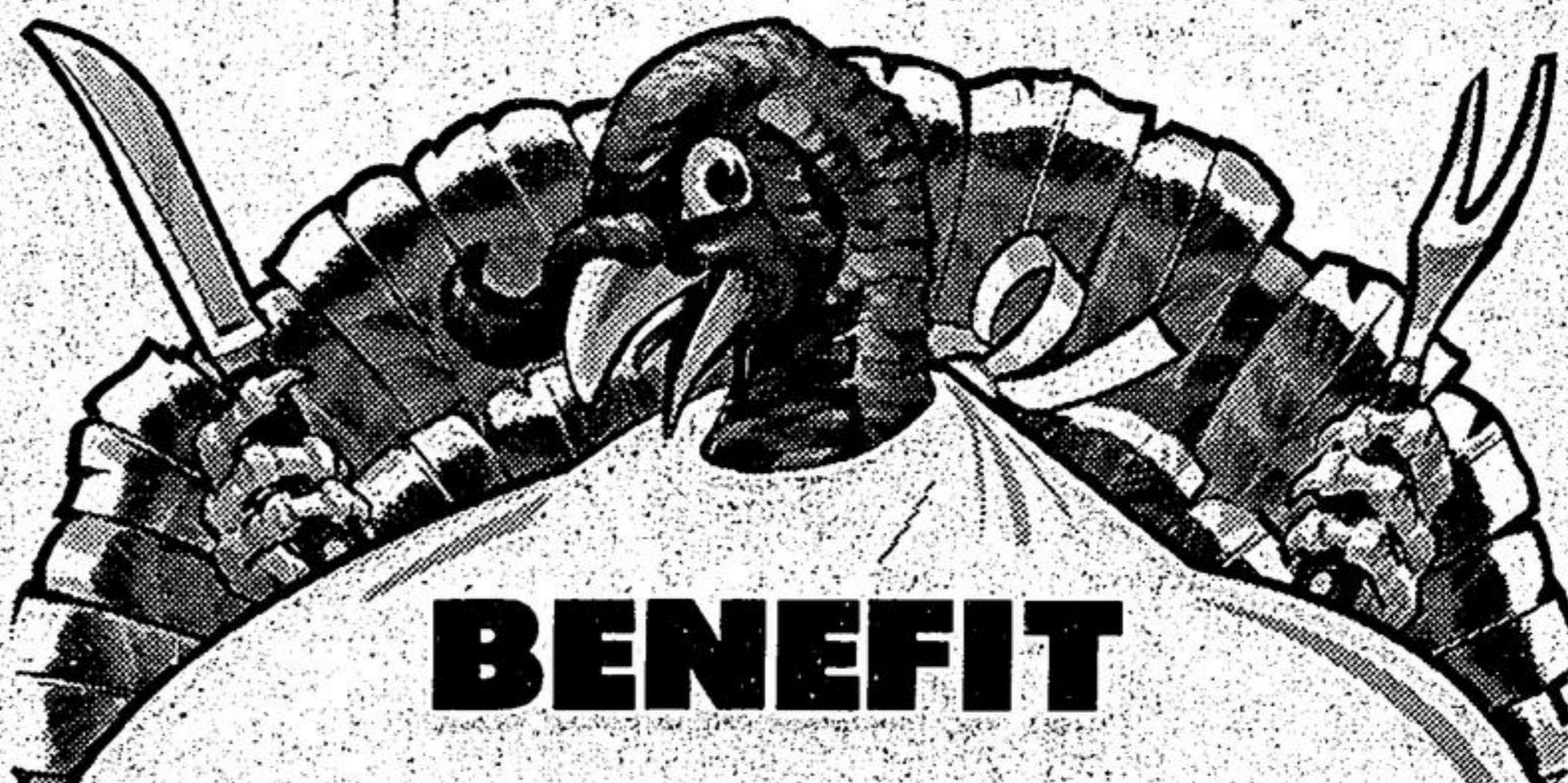
Tires punctured
