Handel's Messiah
Delightful evening but turnout poor

 One of the most delightful musical presentations of the season was given Monday evening at Stouffville United Church as the Stouffville Singers, under the direction of Barbara Sibbick, presented excerpts from Handel's "Messiah".
 The choral work was beautifully done by the choir assisted by guest soloists. Soprano Jean Hammond sang her solos with clarity and feeling. Her interpretations were in keeping with the spirit of that great oratorio.
 Anne Simons sang her numbers in traditional, thrilling style. She was particularly effective in her rendition of "He shall feed His flock like a shepherd." This number is a great favorite of lovers of Handel's music.
 Tenor Bill Bates opened the program by singing a difficult section and doing it unusually well. He sang, "Comfort ye, My people and every valley shall be exalted."
 Jack Jeffrey of Unionville supplied the balance to almost perfect harmony with his assistance to the bass section of the choir. His solos were a pleasant experience in listening.
 The choir was effective in its selections. Mrs. Sibbick did an exciting job in her leadership of the nearly two hours of this traditional Christmas Oratorio.
 The organization background was marvellously supplied by 14-year-old Michael Bloss. His performance of Handel's "Pastoral Symphony" rounded out an evening of inspiration and reflection.
 One disappointing feature was the whole evening was the poor attendance. The church was less than half full.

Action demanded on Summitview
 STOUFFVILLE - The York County Board of Education will be faced with a crucial decision concerning the fate of Summitview Public School at its Jan. 12 meeting.
 The standing committee on Planning and Building last week passed a motion placing the addition to the school on the 1976 Capital Expenditure Forecast.
 If that is approved by the board Jan. 12, the school will be a priority for 1976. At the same meeting, representatives of the Summitview Parent Teacher Association will appear before the board.
 The school renovations were originally on the 1975 Capital Expenditure forecast but it were dropped in the 1976 estimates. A major addition including a general purpose room and resource centre is being sought by the parent-teacher group.

 accountant for the Parsons law firm, said his staff maintained records and he had reviewed the Abel account with the staff.
 "I am satisfied that nine-tenths of the \$130 rentals do not get entered in the trust account."
 Mr. Ness, seeking dismissal of the case, told the court: "The evidence boils down to the fact that Mrs. Downey had the most to do with, with the taking of money from Mr. Halsted." He said that conviction would have to be based on "something more substantial than that."
 Crown Attorney Bill Gorewich agreed the evidence was circumstantial, but felt there was enough for a trial.
 The judge agreed saying there was an "inference of guilt."
