

# Money, jacket stolen from hitch hiker

UXBRIDGE — A Markham hitch-hiker had \$15 and a jacket stolen from him last week after he was picked up on Highway 47.

Ronald Boyce, of Main St., Markham, told police he received a ride from two men in a light blue or brown sedan who

stopped their car just west of Uxbridge and took his cash and jacket.

The two men, believed to be in their late twenties, had talked about doing him bodily harm if he didn't surrender his money. Mr. Boyce told Durham Regional Police.

# Six month sentence for Uxbridge man

YORK REGION — A 22-year-old Uxbridge man was sent to jail for six months after being convicted in Newmarket Provincial Court last week on charges of break, enter and theft, and trafficking in narcotics.

Douglas D. Mackay was jailed six months for breaking into a King Township home last summer and stealing about \$10,000 worth of goods including stereo equipment, jewelry, silverware, and furs.

He was given another four-month term on the trafficking charges which

will be served concurrently with the first conviction. Mackay will also serve a two year term on probation following his release from jail.

Judge Munro heard police evidence which stated that after finding marijuana, a pipe and weigh scales in the accused man's car, in a Markham parking lot, a search of the accused man's home was made.

About 10 ounces of marijuana was found in small plastic bags, a total of \$175 in money was also

found by police in the same kind of bags.

Defense counsel for Mackay said his client was not involved in selling the stuff as a commercial venture. He told the court the Uxbridge man gave it away to friends. Counsel asked for leniency, stating Mackay now unemployed, has a very good work record.

The court was also told that Mackay had broken into the King Township home of his former employer because he felt he had been dealt with unfairly. Counsel

said that the accused man had made no attempt to sell or get rid of the things he had stolen, and had intended to take them back at some time.

Judge Munro passing sentence noted that Mackay had almost a one year's supply of narcotics in his possession. "He might have been growing it for all we know," Judge Munro commented to the court. He also said he could not "swallow" the explanation given by defense counsel that the drug was for the use of friends.
