These sentinels are symbols

The Lighthouse, by Dudley Witney, published by McClelland and Stewart Ltd.

The Lighthouse is a book of photographic integrity and strong, effective text. Photographically it stretches from Pointe Amour on the Labrador Coast to the Florida Keys,

but the story reaches back for the first detailed record of lighthouses to Alexandria and the year 300 B.C.

The background on construction and maintenance is fascinating for many of the structures presented considerable engineering challenge and posed great difficulty in service and supply.

Stripped of romantic lore, the Atlantic Coast has taken more than its share of life and has not yielded its riches without hard work and sacrifice. When one considers the range from early ships to supertankers that now ply the treacherous inland waters of our seaboard, it soon becomes apparent that technological change in shipping has brought new dangers seldom conceived, let alone experienced in the past. The great concern has always been loss of life and cargo, but today, thanks to man, the greatest danger is to the sea itself and the fragile coast that meets it.

Dudley Witney's book carries a warning, often missed or ignored even by those of us who have lived by the sea. The task now before us is to "save the seas from man". It is late in the day. This book is a unique contribution to that fight.

Crash barriers for Vandorf

VANDORF — Crash attenuators will be installed on Woodbine Ave. at the CN overpass in Vandorf.

The move was approved as part of the Engineering Committee report presented to regional council in December.

The apparatus will be placed on both sides of the island on Woodbine Ave. to cushion the impact, should cars hit the bridge support.

The attenuators consist of many cells made of lightweight concrete cylinders which crush in a predetermined manner upon impact of a vehicle. "The vehicle is brought to a full stop prior to hitting the piers, at a deceleration rate which is safe for the human body," the committee report stated.

Two units will be installed at the Vandorf subway at a total cost of \$13,300. They are the first such use of crash barriers on regional roads in York.
