

T.H. (Harry) Paisley

Livestock dealer, former fair chief dies at 77

STOUFFVILLE — One of the first livestock dealers in the area T.H. (Harry) Paisley died Friday at his Main St. West apartment. He was in his 77th year.

Mr. Paisley was born in Uxbridge Township Dec. 8, 1899, the son of Albert and Sarah Paisley. He grew up in the Uxbridge area and on Dec. 20, 1920 married Lillis Chidler.

The family lived in western Canada for some time where the eldest two of the seven children were born. After returning to Stouffville, the Paisleys lived in the large brick house in the town's east end.

Mr. Paisley established one of the first livestock transporting businesses in the area and continued on as a "drover" until his retirement some 10 years ago.

He remained active up to about two months before his death.

Mr. Paisley was active in a number of local organizations. He was a member of the Christian Memorial Church and the Richardson Masonic Lodge. A Masonic service was held in his honor Sunday evening.

He was president of the Markham Fair in 1958. Son Bert was president of the fair in 1971.

Besides his wife, Mr. Paisley leaves four sons — Bert, Eugene, Bruce and Earl and three daughters, Erma (Mrs. Don Sneddon), Erlene (Mrs. Paul Cummings) and Helen (Mrs. William Clark). Also surviving are a brother Bert and a sister Margaret (Mrs. Stokes) as well as 25 grandchildren and 10 great-grandchildren.
