## Driver education fees retained

**YORK CITY:** — A bid to increase driver education fees for York Region night school students was turned down here last week.

While trustees approved holding the student fee at \$70 for 25 hours of in-class instruction and 18 hours of in-car training, they did approve increasing fees paid to the regional driving schools.

A staff recommendation that the fee be increased from \$9.25 per hour to \$10.50 per hour was accepted when trustees were told, "with the increasing numbers of students requesting driver education, staff believes that it will be possible to retain the present fee of \$70."


