Diamond anniversary

 STOUFFVILLE — If one sees Mr. and Mrs. Win Timbers, it hardly seems possible that they have been married for 60 years. The Stouffville couple celebrated that milestone with an open house Saturday.

Over 400 people attended that event. It was March 8, 1916 that the couple were married. Rev. Milton Bricker officiated. Mr. Timbers was the son of Matthew and Sarah Timbers. His bride, the former Mabel Sider was born at Bethesda, the daughter of Asa and Louisa Sider. After a honeymoon in Fort Erie, the couple took up residence at a farm on the 9th Conc. of Markham. For 14 years they lived across from the Christian Church in Ringwood, then moved to Stouffville where they purchased two farms. Their present home on Winona Dr. was built on the original farm. They also owned land south of Main St. Mr. Timbers was well-known for his involvement in competitive plowing. He has been an active plowman himself and saw his son and grandson

follow in his footsteps. Son, Bob Timbers of Sandford represented Canada in World plowing matches. At local matches Mr. Timbers can be seen casting a critical eye at the furrows and offering a word of encouragement to younger plowmen. The Timbers have also been longtime members of Dickson's Hill Missionary Church. Mrs. Timbers has been active in the Stouffville Horticultural Society and still keeps a lovely garden. Mr. Timbers has had wide experience in politics, serving on Markham Township council for nine years, including four as reeve. He was reeve of Stouffville for four years, and served one term here as councillor. Mr. and Mrs. Timbers have four children — two boys and two girls. They include sons Bob of

Sandford and Bruce of Gormley and daughters, Irene of Toronto and Dorothy (Mrs. Lloyd Doner) of Gormley. There are also eight grandchildren and five great grandchildren. Although Mr. Timbers is past 80 years of age, he is still an active real estate agent. Tributes have come in from all directions. Cards from friends and relatives take up much of their living room. Prime Minister Pierre Trudeau sent along a certificate. MPP William Hodgson presented them with a plaque from the provincial government, while Mayor Gordon Ratcliff presented a scroll from the town. Letters were received from Progressive Conservative leader Joe Clark as well as Chairman of Durham Region, Walter Beath.
