According to police the safe contained a quantity of antique coins and a 100 gram gold bar.

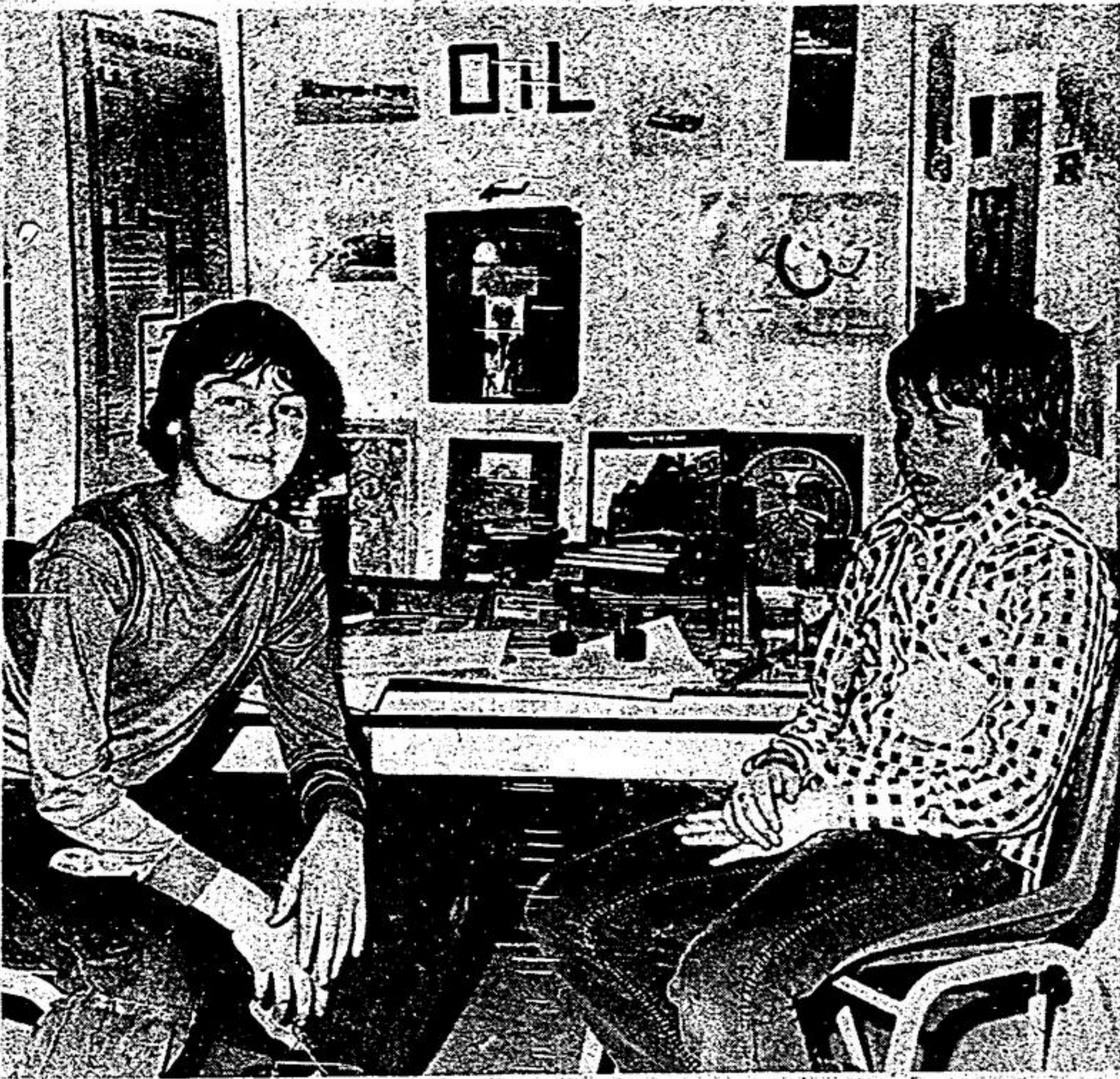
It radio and a gold pocket watch were removed.

### Trial to be set in store robbery

MARKHAM — Two Downsview area youths were remanded in custody pending trial following a show cause hearing before Judge Ian Munro in Newmarket Court last week.

Richard David Hughes, 20, and Donald Frederick Walters, 17, are charged with the robbery of a Beckers Milk Store in Markham. The two were arrested at Orchard Park Blvd. in Thornhill after \$154.90 was stolen from the proprietor of the store.

Witnesses told the police that a man was seen holding a gun prior to the robbery, but that no gun was used in the actual robbery itself.

Judge Munro noted that Walters had been released on an undertaking for charges of break, entry and theft at the time of the alleged offence at the Markham store.

No trial date as yet been set, the two will appear in court again March 19.

### Gravel contract for local firm

STOUFFVILLE — Council has awarded the 1976 gravel contract to Lee Sand and Gravel.

Of the five tenders submitted Lee's was the lowest at \$2.35 a ton spread on the road and \$1.80 a ton to be picked up by the town trucks.

The contract calls for the delivery and spreading of 12,000 tons of crushed gravel and the provision of an additional 5,000 tons to be picked up at the pit.


Four other gravel companies submitted sealed bids. The highest quoted price was from Miller Paving, who wanted, respectively, \$3.25 and \$1.95 a ton. Gormley Sand and Gravel quoted \$2.70 and \$1.95, while Giordano requested \$2.75 and \$1.70, and Pitt Haulage who asked \$2.45 and \$1.70.




